BACKGROUND

MOST STUDENTS CAN LEARN BUT THE CIRCUMSTANCES OF A CHILDS LIFE ARE IMPORTANT SIGN POSTS AS TO WHETHER OR NOT ACHIEVEMENT WILL COME WITH GREAT OBSTACLES.

SCHOOL

TEACHER/PUPIL INTERACTIONS: TEACHERS ARE INEVITABLY INVOLVED IN MAKING JUDGEMENTS AND CLASSIFYING PUPILS.

IF TEACHERS HAVE LOW EXPECTATIONS OF WORKING-CLASS CHILDREN, THIS CAN AFFECT THEIR PROGRESS IN SCHOOL.

EQUALLY, IF THE TEACHER SEES THE STUDENT AS ONLY BEING CAPABLE OF REACHING A CERTAIN LEVEL OF ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT.

PARENTAL INFLUENCE
THE HOME ENVIRONMENT SHAPES A CHILDS
INITIAL VIEW OF LEARNING.

HOW INTERESTED YOUR PARENTS ARE WITH
THEIR CHILDS EDUCATION CAN BE THE
DIFFERENCE IN THAT CHILDS EDUCATION BE A
SUCCESS OR A FALIURE.

CULTURAL DEPRIVATION

THE NORMS AND VALUES OF TE WORKING-CLASS CHILD DIFFER FROM THE NORMS AND VALUES OF MIDDLE-CLASS INSTITUTION OF SCHOOLS.

BOURDIEU, (1977) SUGGESTED THAT MIDDLE-CLASS CULTURAL CAPITAL IS AS VALUABLE IN EDUCATIONAL TERMS AS MATERIAL WEALTH. THE KNOWLEDGE, VALUES, WAYS OF INTERACTING AND COMMUNICATING IDEAS THAT MIDDLE-CLASS CHILDREN POSSESS ARE DEVELOPED FURTHER AND REWARDED BY THE EDUCATION SYSTEM. WORKING-CLASS CHILDREN MAY LACK THOSE QUALITIES AND SO DO NOT HAVE THE SAME CHANCES TO SUCEED.

MIDDLE-CLASS CHILDREN ARE MOST LIKELY TO HAVE THEIR WRITING AND SPEAKING SKILLS DEVELOPED TO A HIGHER STANDARD AT AN EARLIER AGE THAN WORKING-CLASS SUCCESS.

MATERIAL DEPRIVATION

LACK OF MONEY CAN MEAN A COLD AND OVERCROWDED HOUSE, INADEQUATE LEVELS OF NUTRITION AS WELL AS LACK OF BOOKS, COMPUTERS, ETC. THIS CAN MAKE IT DIFFICULT TO STUDY AT HOME AND MAY LEAD TO POOR SCHOOL ATTEENDANCE THROUGH ILL HEALTH.
