Fall of Rome 476 AD


#### What Came? Life After?

- Life in a manor as a peasant was being able to own land and would take grain from the mill and take it to the bakery to cook.
- Lords would own the land and would give some to peasants in exchange for service and would protect the peasants.
- Peasants could have their own vassal by giving them land they own in exchange for service.
- They weren't able to leave the manor without the lords permission and the lord determined who their daughters married
- Serfs were "free" weren't slaves but couldn't leave
- Serfs had to take care of shard crops and king's crops
- Manors started to become more self sufficient
- Trade started to decline
- From the manor and feudalism the economic system known as Manorialism also developed
