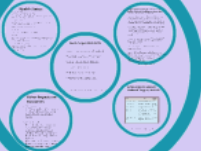

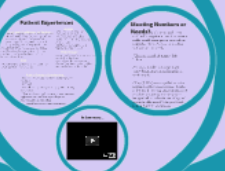

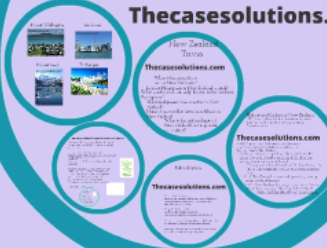

Universal health care system that provides a broad range of health and disability services funded by general taxes.

Ministry of Health: develops policy and provides leadership.

Ministry of Health: composed of human units: National Health Board, Chief Nurse, Policy, Clinical Leadership, research and regulation, Māori Health, Service Capability and Implementation, and Corporate Services. Management and development of the system.
