










After that it brings him to where they are now, at the dinner party. The time traveler is tired and exhausted after his travels. The next day he leaves again, however, this time he is never seen again.

# Favorite Part

My Favorite part of the book is when time traveler goes to the year 802,701 AD and meets the human-like creatures called Eloi.
