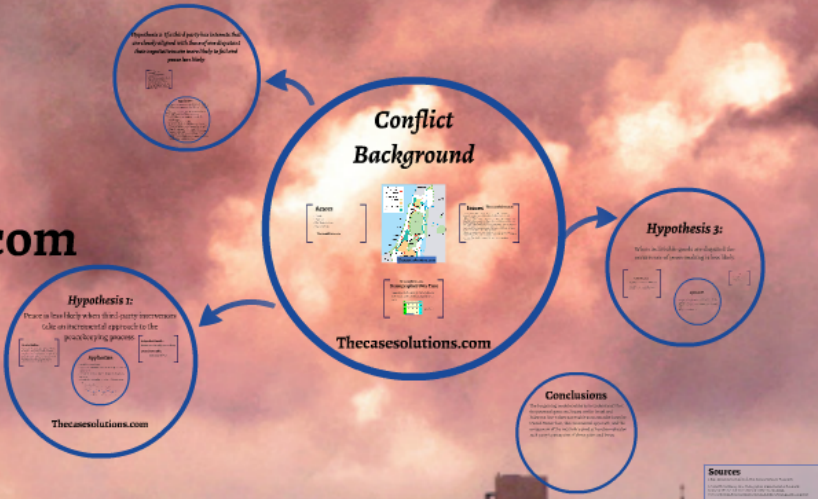


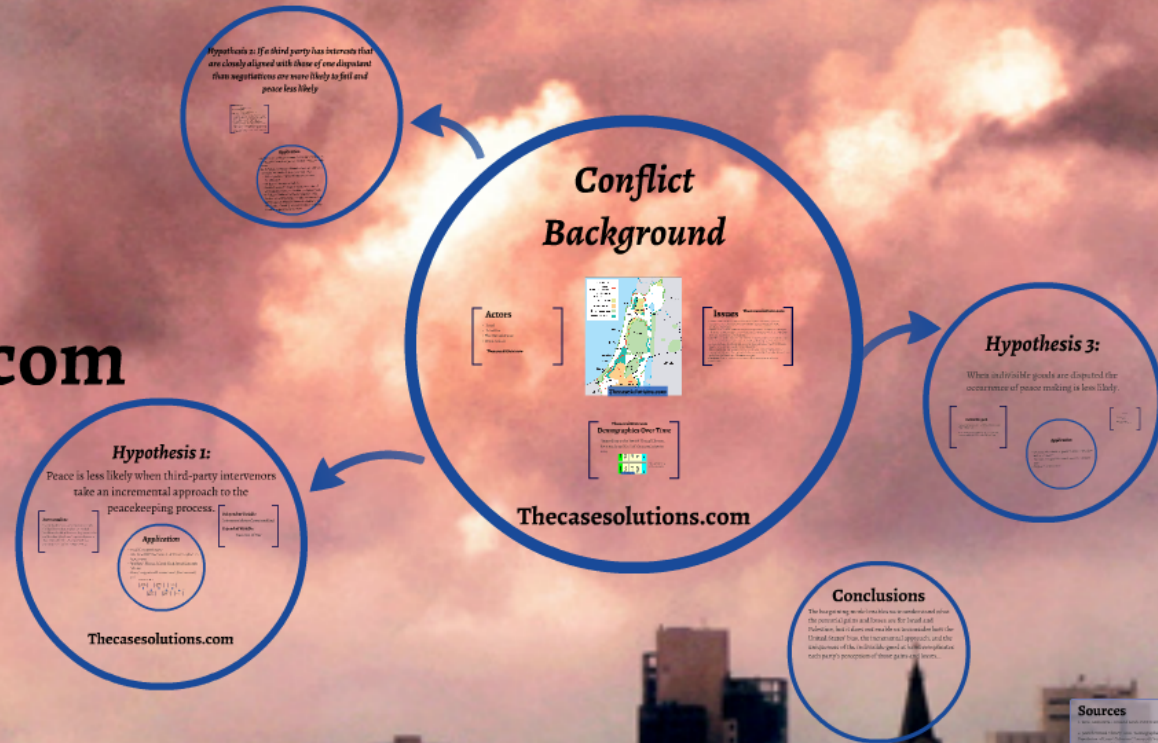

- Bose discussion of Laqueur and Said sentiments (Laqueur - author of sympathetic account of the movement born of Zionism and Said - author of "Zionism from the standpoint of its victims"):
- **Laqueur:** "It was not the Arab's fault that Jews were persecuted in Europe,' and it was quite logical that 'from the Arab point of view Zionism was an aggressive movement, [and] Jewish immigration an invasion' of their homeland."
- **Said:** "We cannot fail to connect the horrific history of anti-Semitic massacres [in Europe] to the establishment of Israel, nor can we fail to understand the depths, the extent and the overpowering legacy of suffering and despair that informed the post-World War II Zionist movement...Palestinians...are the victims of the victims."
- **Where they diverge:** *Laqueur* Argues that the Zionist movement's intellectual origins are connected with the wave of national revivals that accompanied the French Revolution, whereas *Said* believes that Zionist was of "European provenance."
- **Conclusion** - They both make clear sense when different vantage points taken into consideration.

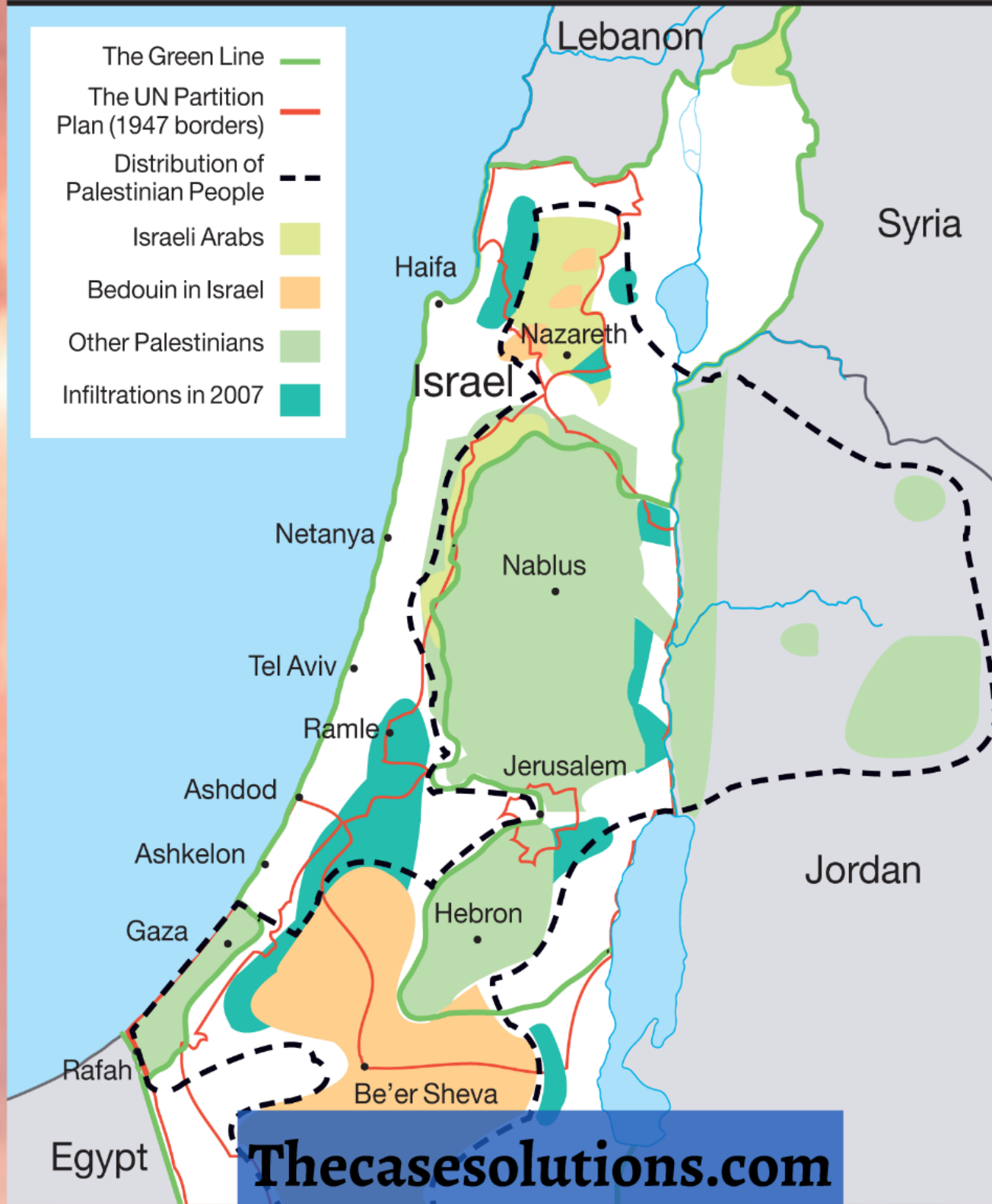

# Hypothesis 1:

Peace is less likely when third-party intervenors take an incremental approach to the peacekeeping process.

## **Incrementalism:**

"a strategy of step-by-step progress toward a final settlement that emphasizes gradual 'confidence building' between the parties in the conflict through a phased, sequenced process that tackles the relatively minor and less-contentious issues first." (Bose 2007, 4)

## **Independent Variable:**

Incrementalism of peacemaking

## **Dependent Variable:**

Duration of war
