- Son of John Adams, the United States'
 2nd president.
- In 1775, him and his mother watched the Battle of Bunker Hill from their family farm.

Adolescence

- At age 10, he traveled to France with his father on a trip.
- By age 14, he was doing on the job training in the Diplomatic Corps as well as receiving an education
- In 1781, he went with diplomat Francis
 Dana to Russia as a secretary and
 translator

- In 1783 he went with his father to Paris to be a secretary, who was neotiating the Treaty of Paris.
- He stayed Europe till 1785, during this time he became fluent in French, Dutch, and German.
 - He returned to the United States in 1785, and graduated from Harvard University in 1787.

- In 1790, he became an attorney in Boston, Massachusetts.
- By 1793 he had been appointed the United States' Minister to Holland by George Washington.
 - This was the beginning of Adams' long political career as a respected bureaucrat.

- In Early 1797 his father becomes president
- His father also appointed him United
 States' minister to Prussia in 1797
 - On the way to Prussia, he stopped in England to marry Louisa Catherine Johnson, daughter of the United Consol to Great Britain.

- In 1800 he returned to America from Prussia.
- In 1802 he was elected to the Massachusetts Legislature.
- By 1803 he had been elected to the United
 States' Senate.
 - He was considered a federalist
 in the senate.

Personal History 1808-1813

- In June 1808 he resigned from the senate and becomes a Democratic-Republican.
- In 1809 he returns to the Diplomatic Corps to train students.
 - He became the United States' minister to Russia in 1809 as well.
