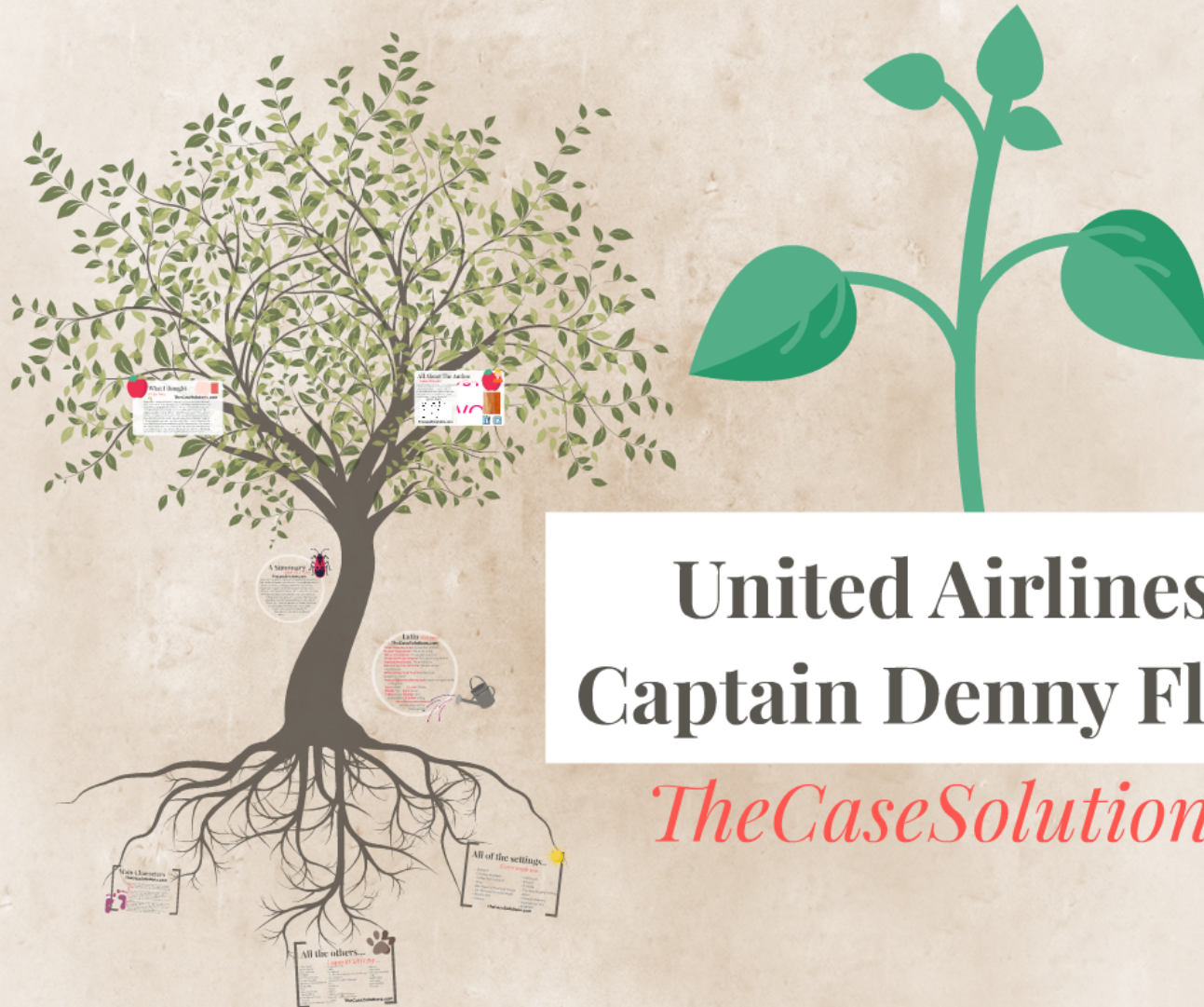

Father Pat: Rosa's good friend whose a priest, and he teachers Rosa and Katie latin. He also is a great friend to have.



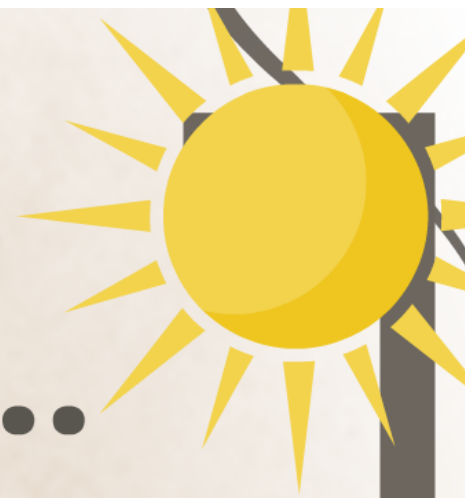
