Only 15% of all South Koreans live below the poverty line. The poverty line in South Korea is defined as relative poverty, and operationalized as the share of the population living on less than half of the median income. (Median household income in South Korea in 2007 was \$19,179).





# *Sanitation*



92% of South Koreans have access to clean water, properly treated sewage and weekly garbage disposal from their house. The water quality in South Korea is excellent and can come from multiple sources such as rivers, lakes, streams and underground wells and springs.

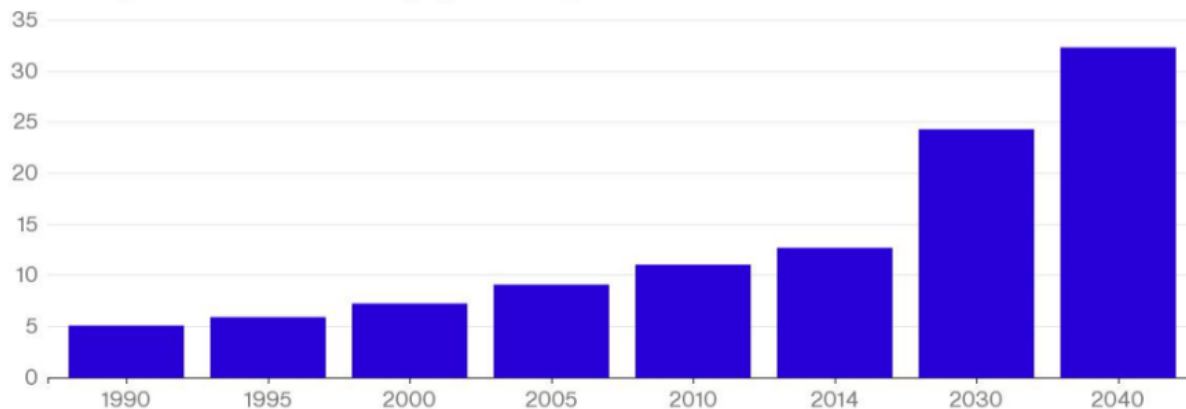
# Health Care

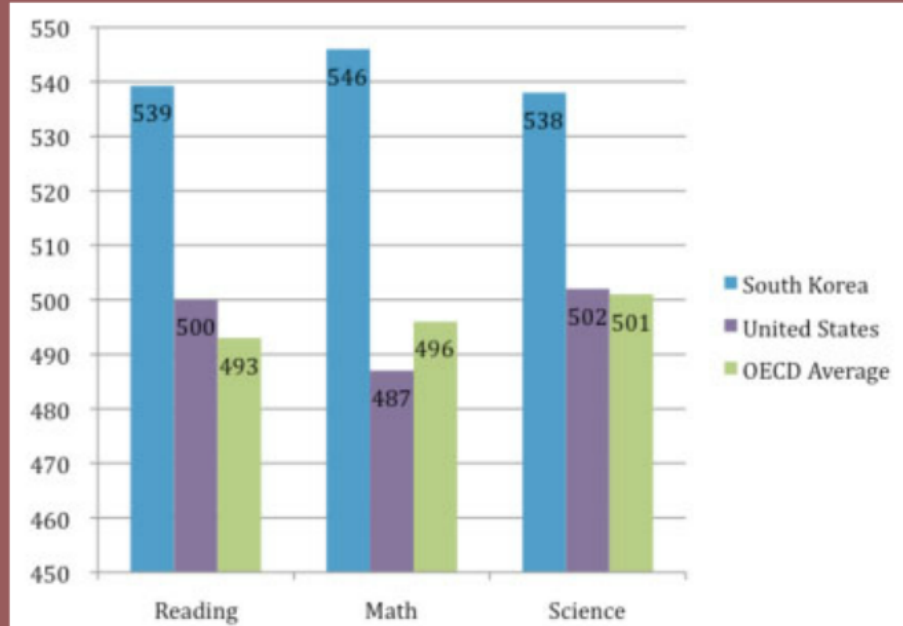


# Education
