# 4.2 Surveys Thecasesolutions.com

All of the following surveys should carried out at an early stage and are key to a project's success:

- Asbestos survey Implemented at earliest point to existing buildings.
- Full Structural Survey Imperative that a structural survey is carried out as soon as possible, in order to assess implications of works to existing structures.
- Underground Services Survey M & E Consultants in conjunction with AU internal M & E Surveyors.
- Existing Building survey Architect / Designer.
- Topographical, Ecological & Ground Investigation— Enables assessment of financial implications, planning and design.
