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HISTORY OF VOLKSWAGEN

Literally, the word "volkswagen" means "people's car."

In Germany, in the year 1930, Ferdinand Porsche had just set up an automotive design company. Later in 1933, Adolf Hitler met Ferdinand Porsche to discuss Hitler's idea of a volkswagen. Hitler proposed a people's car that could carry 5 people, cruise up to 62mph, return 33mpg, and cost only 1000 Reich Marks. This was an opportunity for Porsche to push his idea of a small car forward, as was it to help Hitler get a real people's car for the citizens of Germany. Volkswagen was finally established in 1937 by the German Labour Front which served the Nazi Trade union.

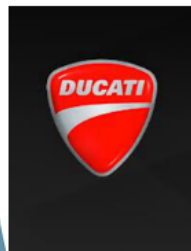

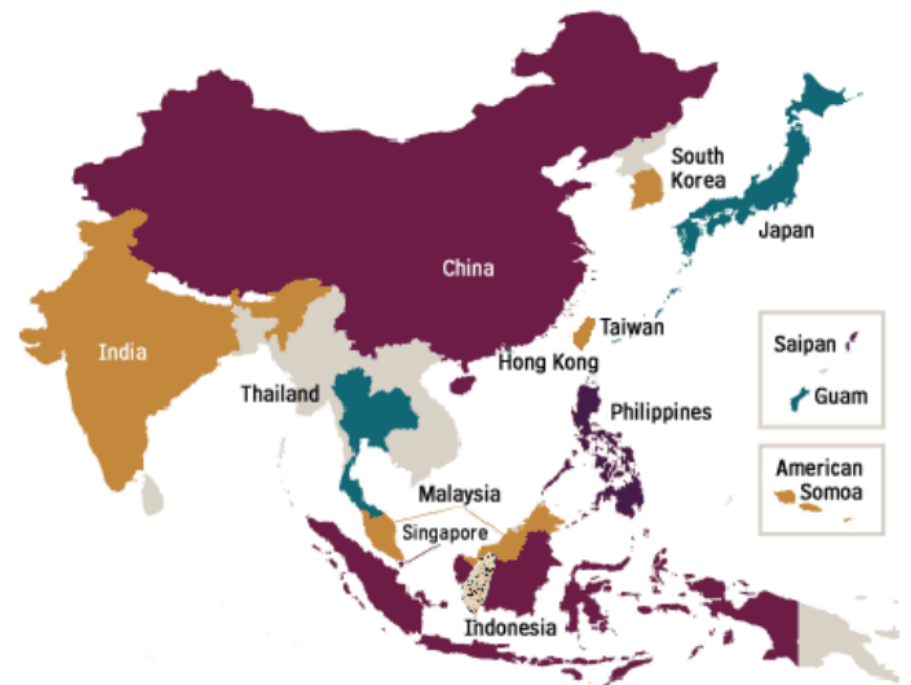
