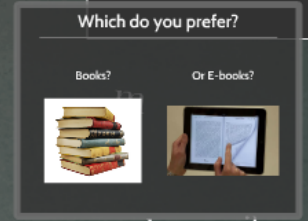

How this is a learning stretch



"If you order a book online and have it shipped 500 miles by air, that creates roughly the same pollution and waste as making the book in the first place. Driving five miles to the bookstore and back causes about 10 times the pollution and resource depletion as producing it. You would need to drive to a store 300 miles away to create the equivalent in toxic impacts on health of making one e-reader..." (Goleman, 1).



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
