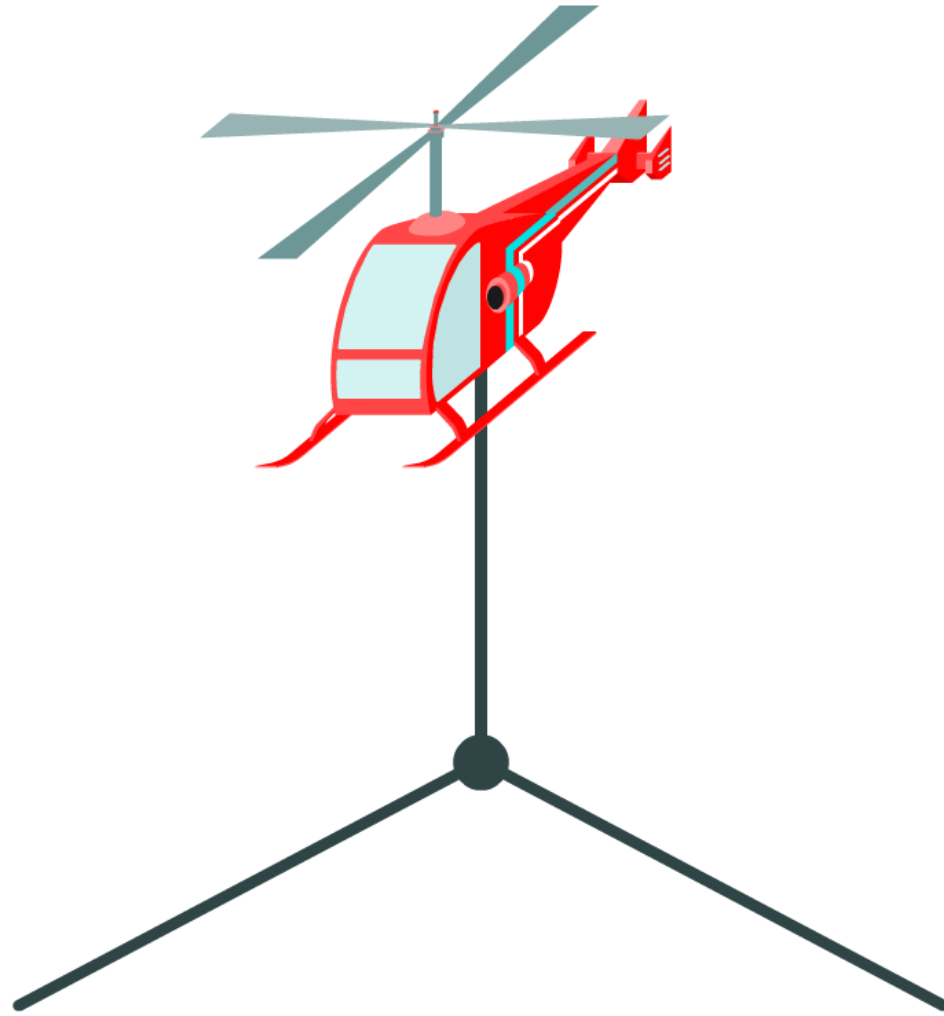

- Two major types of buildings:
 1. Double basement, bow-fronted rowhouse with a mansard roof
 2. Low basement, flat-fronted rowhouse faced with brick and often adorned with a projecting oriel window
- Adequate sidewalks
- Wider boulevards smaller/narrow side streets
- Roads maintained through resident reporting
- Street cleaning!
- Weekly trash collection
