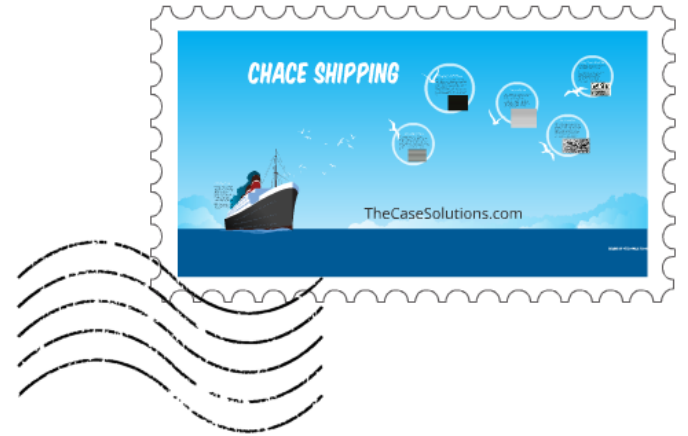

Comfort for All Classes

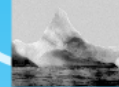

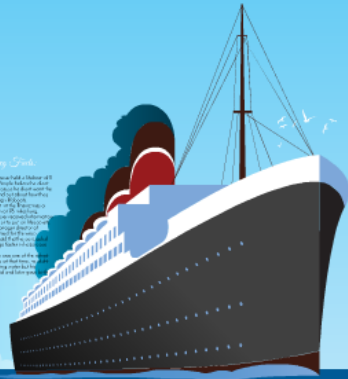

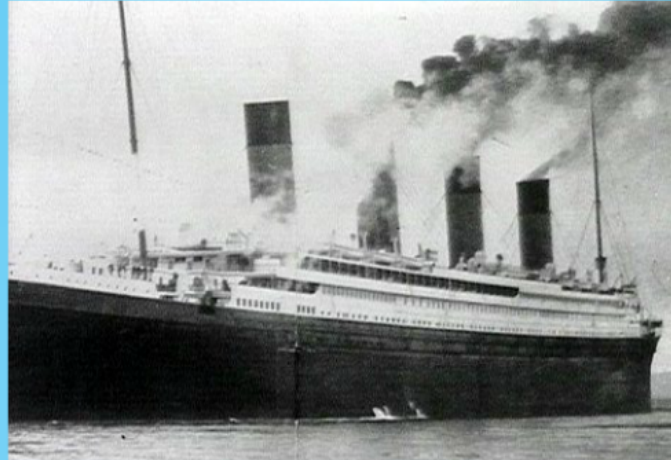

Interesting Facts:

- Captain Smith never held a lifeboat drill like most ships. People believe he didn't have the drill because he didn't want the passengers to find out about how they didn't have enough lifeboats.
- The iceberg that hit the Titanic was a small to medium at 78 miles long.
- Some people never received information about the crash or to put on life jackets.
- Bruce Ismay (manager director of Titanic) was blamed for the wreck because it was said that he persuaded the Captain to go faster in hazardous waters.
- John Jacob Aster was one of the richest men in the world at that time, he didn't survive the freezing water but his pregnant wife did and later gave birth to his child.
