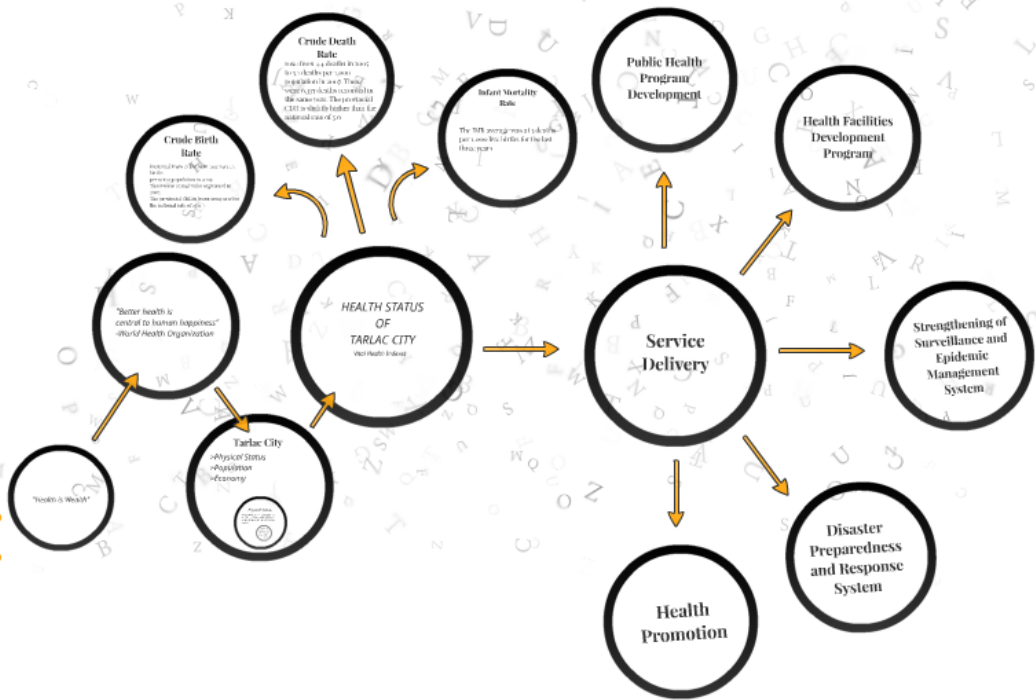



Physical Status

The province of Tarlac, based on the modified Coronas Classification of Philippine Climate, falls under Type 1 climate

Population

Tarlac is ranked based on terms of population size among the 8 provinces of the highly urbanized cities in Central Luzon Region: Zambales, Marikina, Pangasinan, Tarlac, and Bulacan. It is the 7th largest in the region.

Physical Status

The province of Tarlac, based on the modified Coronas Classification of Philippine Climate, falls under Type 1 climate

Population

Tarlac ranked fourth in terms of population size among the six provinces and two highly urbanized cities in Central Luzon Region (Bataan, Bulacan, Nueva Ecija, Pampanga, Tarlac, Zambales, Olongapo City and Angeles City), contributing 13.31 percent to the eight million population of the region.

Economy

The economy of Tarlac is dominated by agriculture. The major agricultural products are rice, sugarcane, and other crops.
