
Relatives

- Oligochaete worms.

Anatomy

- Earthworms are invertebrates. That is, they do not have a backbone. Insects, sea stars, spiders, jellyfish, and millipedes are other examples of invertebrate animals.
- Some species of Earthworms have a body composed of over 100 segments




Diet

Earthworms feed on decaying organic matter in the soil. The worms eat the bacteria, fungi and algae that live in the dirt. The nutrients in the soil are partially digested by the worms, making the soil easier used by the plants.
