

What is Carnival?

Carnaval (Carnival in English) is a festive season that occurs immediately after the religious season of Lent, so the main events usually occur in February. It typically involves a parade or public celebration. People often dress up during celebrations. They mostly occur in Hispanic countries, but the Netherlands, Germany, Portugal and multiple others celebrate it as well. Costumes, dancing, music, and parades are all part of the annual celebration of Carnival in many countries throughout the world. Fat Tuesday, also known as Mardi Gras, marks the end of this weeks long celebration before the beginning of Lent.



How Are the Days of Carnival Determined?

The Brazil Carnival dates are entirely linked to the Church calendar. The actual date of Easter is determined by the moon and consequently changes every year. It always falls between March 22nd and April 25th. Historically, Easter is supposed to be the first Sunday after the full moon following the spring equinox. Since astronomers were unable to predict the exact dates of all the future full moons, the Council of Nicea decided in 325 AD to design a formula that would calculate approximate moon dates. This would allow the church to create a calendar for all the years to come and ambiguity on the subject could be avoided. The formula has remained the same ever since except for a minor change in 1583 AD. The full moon based on Ecclesiastical Tables is called the Paschal moon and usually varies 2 to 3 days from the actual full moon. Irrespective, the date of Easter is set as the first Sunday after the Paschal full moon and the Brazil Carnival get its dates from this formula. Carnival originated from a Roman celebration and extended throughout Europe during the Middle Ages. It can be traced back to Lent, the period of the year in which moral and food restrictions are imposed on followers. Before bidding farewell to certain passions such as meat during the Lent period, parties took place in which people ate and drank without control. Although many authorities throughout history have tried to prohibit the Carnival celebration, the festivities survived and are now more popular than ever.

Some Carnival Celebrations in Europe

- Italy- Viareggio throws one of the most liveliest Carnavale parties in Italy. It lasts for three weeks before "Fat Tuesday" with concerts, masked balls, and cultural events. On Sundays throughout the carnival season, vibrant parades march through the streets.
- Germany- Cologne, Germany throws a street party for a million spectators each year. Running from Thursday to Ash Wednesday, there are city sponsored parades and stage shows.

 Throughout the week long "crazy days" festivities, people wear masquerades, greeting

one another with "Cologne alive!"
