




How many people are affected by HIV AIDS and die per year?



Race .vs. Race



South Africa ranked #1 in the top 100 countries to have the highest amount of diagnosis and cases dealing with Aids. Sub-Saharan Africa is the worst. Including 2.3 million children living with it as well.
