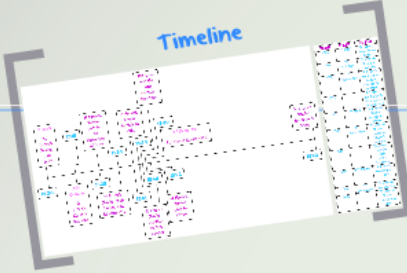
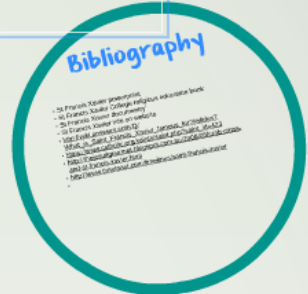

Miracle of the cross and crab

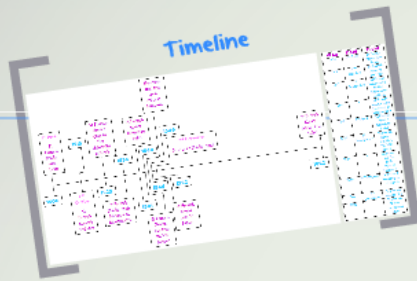
