Positions and Occupations held before becoming President

- Born April 13, 1743
- Jefferson had three sisters and one brother
- He spent most of his time roaming the woods and studying his books
- Jefferson was a young country lawyer. He practiced law on a circuit
- Jefferson married Ms. Martha Wayles Skelton on January 1, 1772
- Jefferson was a member of the House of Burgesses from 1769 to 1774
- He played an active role in the organization of the Virginia Committee of Correspondence
- Jefferson wrote "Summary View of the Rights of British America" in 1774. This document propelled him to a larger spotlight.
- He became known as the man of immense abilities in articulating the colonial positions for independence.
- He stood with Patrick Henry arguing that the British Parliament had no authority in the colonies
- Thomas Jefferson wrote the Declaration of Independence
- He is one of our founding fathers
- He was a member of the Virginia House of Delegates
- Served 2 years as governor of Virginia
- Served as America's minister to France
- Served as Washington's secretary of state

Important events during presidency

- March 4, 1801 Thomas Jefferson was elected as the 3rd president of the U.S.
- May 14, 1801 Yusuf Karamini, pasha of Tripoli declares war on the U.S.
- December 8, 1801 President Jefferson delivers his first address to the newly convened seventh congress of the U.S.
- January 8, 1802 A convention between the U.S. and Britain regarding the treaty of 1794 is concluded
- March 16, 1802 Congress recognizes the War with Tripoli, authorizing the arming of merchant ships to ward off attacks
- March 16, 1802 Congress reduces the size of the U.S. army to its 1796 limits
- April 6, 1802 Taxes on whiskey are repealed
- April 30, 1802 President Jefferson signs the Enabling Act
- January 11, 1803 Jefferson appoints James Monroe minister of France and Spain
- February 19, 1803 Ohio officially becomes the seventeenth state of the union
- May 23, 1803 Jefferson commissions Commodore Edward Preble as commander of the U.S navy
- December 9, 1803 Congress passes the twelfth amendment
- March 26, 1804 Congress passes the Louisiana Territory Act
- September 25, 1804 the twelfth amendment is ratified
- December 5, 1804 Jefferson is reelected
