The introduction of the iPod in 2001 and iTunes in 2003 brought the music industry out of turmoil.

.iTunes was the first legitimate store for digital music that could compete with piracy sites like Napster.

The iPod and iTunes changed the way people discovered new music.

.When viewing an album or artist, iTunes gives recommendations so users can find similar songs and purchase more music.



The downloading of digital music helped record labels get paid faster and got rid of their losses from damages.

.iTunes gave independent artists promotional space alongside artists from major labels, so they could compete with the top artists and gain more recognition

Downsides

.While mostly beneficial to the music industry, iTunes was also damaging in some ways.

.It made the single popular, and consumers stopped purchasing entire albums.

According to the Recording Industry Association of America, since iTunes' introduction in 2003, music sales in the US have plummeted from 11.8 billion to 7.1 billion in 2013.
