


What is the "iron triangle"?

 Closed, mutually supportive relationships that often occur and prevail in government in the United States

Thecasesolutions.com Who is involved?

 Relationships occur between government agencies, special interest lobbying organizations, and the legislative committees or subcommittees with jurisdiction over a particular area of government policy

Relation to Defense

The following all work together to benefit one another...

- Congress (House and Senate committees on Armed Services)
- Defense Contractors
- U.S. Department of Defense

Relation to Agriculture

- Agribusiness seeks benefits from the government, like subsidies
- U.S. Department of Agriculture services these constituencies
- Senators and representatives seek office

These relationships result in a push for subsidies by senators

Thecasesolutions.com Example: The Carlyle Group

- One of the largest investment banks in the world, based in Washington D.C.
- Known as the best connected company in the world
- Invests in areas closely tied to government policy, accumulated wealth mainly through investments in defense
- Payroll includes George Bush, John Major (former British Prime Minister), Lou Gerstner (former chairman of IBM), and Fidel Ramos (former Prime Minister of the Philippines)


 Movement of personnel between roles as legislators and regulators and the industries affected by the legislation and regulation
