It's not in the service industry, it's in the primary department of labor with a level of security in the industry that you can't lose your job. In many cases, basic industries are the backbone of the economy and they are needed to support the non-basic industries.

There are three types of basic industries: 1. **Extractive Industries** - These are industries that extract raw materials from the earth. Examples include mining, logging, and fishing. 2. **Manufacturing Industries** - These are industries that produce goods from raw materials. Examples include steel, paper, and textiles. 3. **Transportation Industries** - These are industries that move goods and people from one place to another. Examples include shipping, trucking, and airlines.

These industries revolve around taking the raw materials that were gathered from the primary industries and manufacturing them into finished products. The products can include furniture, frozen foods, cereal, clothing, etc. Secondary industries are primarily located in towns and cities, mostly in more densely populated areas. This is because although the companies don't want to be too close to people because of the fumes and pollution they cause in the air, they want to be close because shipping will cost less. Manufacturing (the most important secondary industries) employs three times as many people than all primary industries combined.
