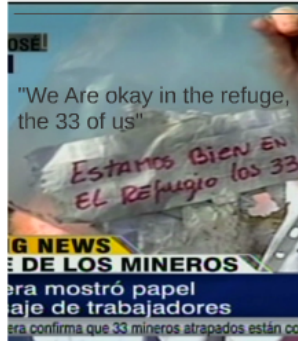

How were they rescued?

The final rescue attempt

- The capsule was sent down to rescue the miners and their families
- On October 23, 2010 the final rescue, Francisco Antonio Ayala, who was only 33 years old, came out of the collapsed mine at 12:11 AM ET
- After 21 more miners came out the mine after 80 days, the final rescue, Luis Aldunate, 33 years old, came out at 12:12 PM ET

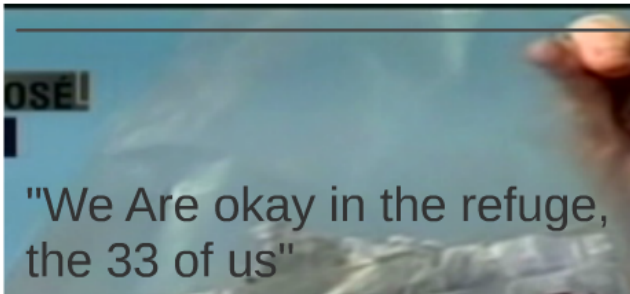

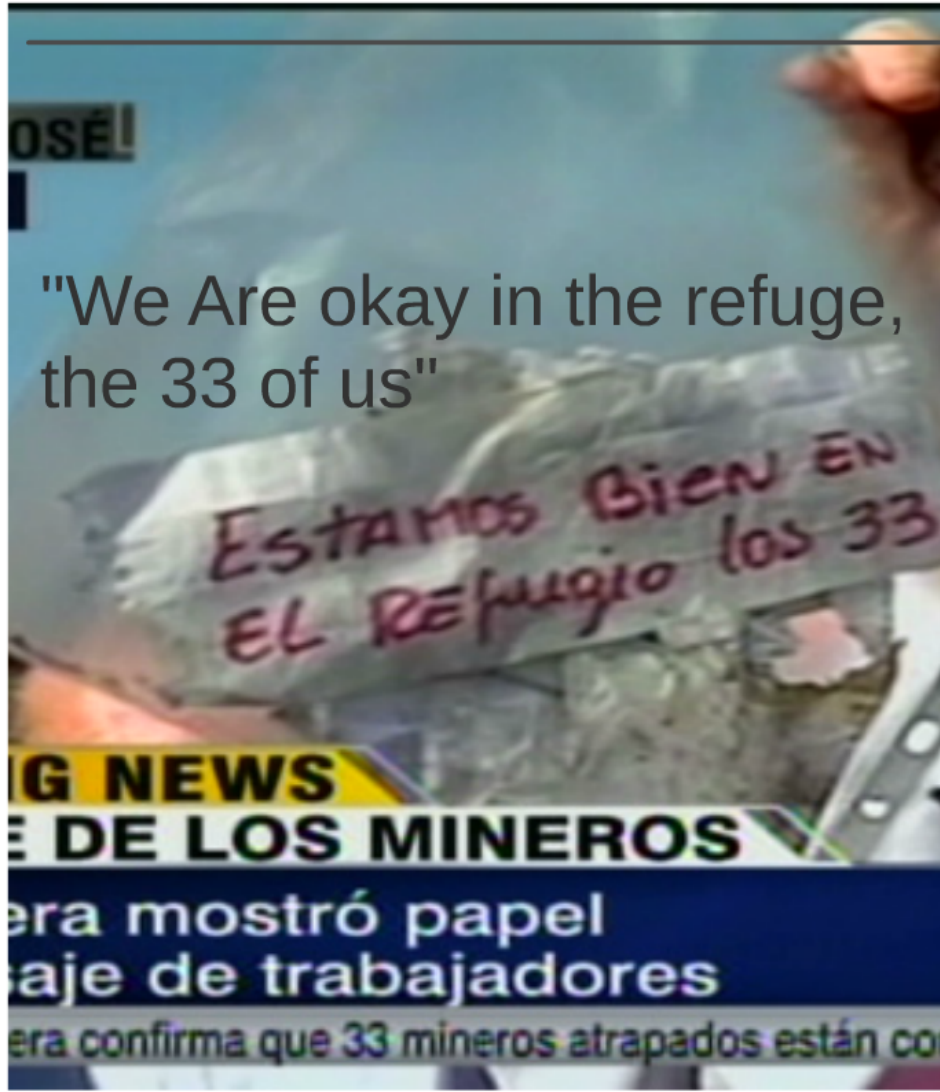

How were they rescued?

The big day has come!!

- The capsule was sent down to medically clear the miners and then send them up
- On October 13, 2010 the first miner, Florencio Antonio Avalos Silva who was only 31 years old, came out of the collapsed mine at 12:11 AM ET.
- After 31 more miners came out of the mine after Silva, the final miner ,Luis Alberto Urzua Iribarren, came out 22 1/2 hours later.
- The miners were greeted by their family who were waiting for days



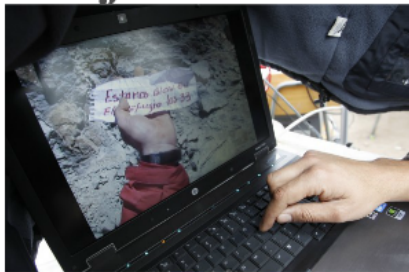

- Many of the miners felt the blame for the accident was the mine owners
- The owners blamed the miners
- Prosecutors said it was natural causes because of the proof(provided by congressional investigation comity)
- Prosecutors made their own investigations
- "Free and happy going about with their (Mr, Bohn and Mr. Kemeny)lives, even though they left us buried underground," Mr. Seplveda told the Web site Soy Chile.

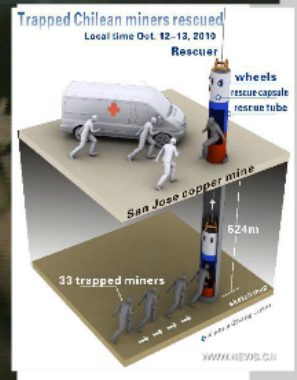
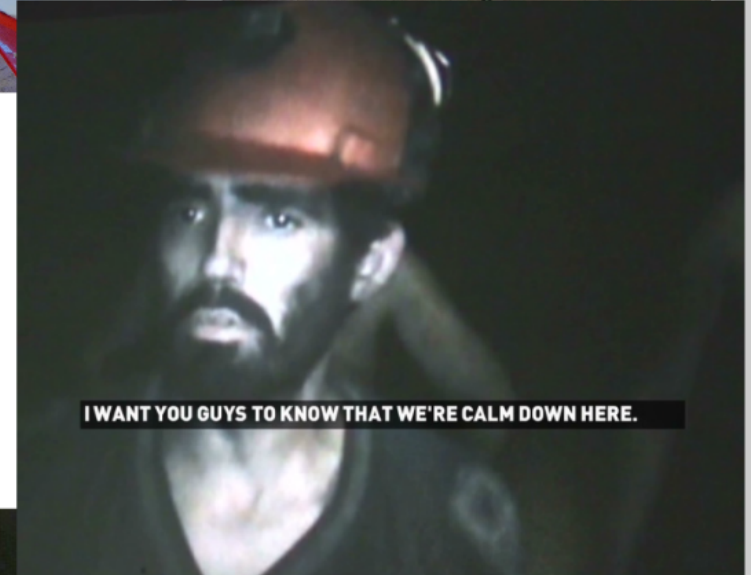
