The Earthquake hit on March 11th in 2011 with a massive magnitude of 9.0 causing many deaths and plenty of injuries all of Tōhoku

It has been proved that an earthquake with a magnitude of 8.0 happens only about 40 times a year, so an earthquake with a magnitude of 9.0 is very rare and very dangerous

The earthquake affected many people and on February 10th 2014 a Japanese National Police Agency report confirmed a massive number of 15,884 deaths, 6,148 injured and 2,633 people missing
