Industry, Innovation and Infrastructure

Sustainable Cities and Communities

Half of humanity, 3.5 billion people, lives in cities today.
 828 million people live in slums today and the number keeps rising.



Quality Education

Enrollment in primary education in developing countries has reached 91%.
 57 million children remain out of school.



Responsible Consumption and Production

Each year, 1/3rd of all food produced equivalent to 1.3 billion tonnes worth around 1 trillion euros is going to the bin due to consumer and retailers or spoiling due to poor transportation and processing practices.



Gender Equality

Two thirds of countries in the developing regions have achieved gender parity in primary education.



Climate Action

From 1980 to 2012, average global temperature increased by 0.85 Celsius.
 For each degree of temperature increase, grain yields decline by about 5 percent.



Clean Water And Sanitation

2.6 billion people have gained improved drinking water sources since 1990.
 663 million people are still without drinking water!
