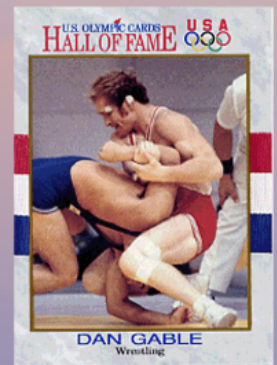


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Experience- Dan Gable

If I could pick one athlete for all of the leadership traits it would be Dan Gable, however the trait he stands out the most in is his experience in leadership. Dan Gable is in the Olympic Wrestling Hall of Fame and is regarded by many as the best wrestler of all time for going undefeated on his high school varsity team for all four years, his record of 181-1 in his collegiate years, his record of 30-1 internationally, and his victory at the 1972 Olympic Games during which he never gave up a single point to his opponents. What makes him exceptional is not only his skills as an athlete but also as a leader after his wrestling career. Gable is also famous for his time coaching at Iowa State University. During this time he led the Hawkeyes to 16 NCAA championships in his 21 years as head coach. His time as a coach generated 152 All-Americans, 45 national champions and 12 Olympians. Gable currently is retired but spends most of his time with motivational speaking to wrestlers and non-wrestlers alike and from this he has changed the world of wrestling, the world of sport, and the lives of many all over the world. Due to his accomplishments October 25 is recognized as Dan Gable Day in Iowa. Gable has wrestled for 18 years, coached for 35 years at the NCAA and as the Team U.S.A Olympic Wrestling head coach, and has been doing public speaking for the last 8 years. An Impeccable Example- Anthony Robles

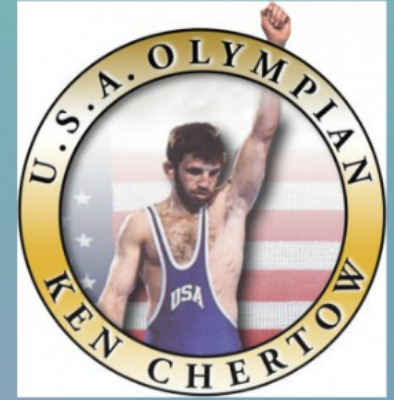
Anthony Robles was born in Mesa, Arizona in 1988. He was born with only one leg and was unable to wear a prosthetic leg because his leg was missing all the way up to the hip leaving nothing to attach the prosthesis to. By the eighth grade Robles started to wrestle and in the beginning he did not do very well, however he did not give up and he began to improve. When he was in the tenth grade he fought his way up to sixth place in the state and in his final two years of high school he realized that he could turn his disadvantage into an advantage and as a result he went undefeated while winning two state championships. This was not enough for Robles, he continued on to the college level at Arizona State University's division 1 team. While wrestling at the college level he received many awards and qualified for the NCAA championships all four years, even winning the NCAA division 1 championship at 125 pounds his final year in 2011. His story and his dedication is inspiring to many and since these events Robles has become a motivational speaker looking to give people with similar problems to his the confidence that they need to accomplish their goals.



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Takes Initiative- Ken Chertow

Ken Chertow is an American wrestler and Olympic athlete in the 1988 Seoul Games. He had won 3 NCAA championships and 2 junior world championships in college. At the end of his time at college, Chertow had started a local wrestling school and in the coming years he had developed a great focus for coaching youth wrestling programs and because of this his program spread to cover many camp locations all over the United States. I was lucky enough to go to one of these camps in San Francisco and learn from and wrestle with Chertow. He said that he was never really a very skilled wrestler but what he did was take initiative for himself and make up for what he lacked in skill with increasing his endurance, his power, and his drive. Further, he took initiative when he created his camp system and now his camps have created over 500 state champions. He had also taken Ohio State, a relatively moderate wrestling school and turned it into a relevant school at the national level with the best performances in Ohio State history being under the coaching of Chertow. Chertow has established himself as one of the greatest coaches in wrestling today and one of the greatest leaders in athletics all through the initiative that he had to improve himself and then to improve the lives of others.



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Emotionally Stable- Mark Schultz

Mark Schultz was born in Palo Alto, California in 1960 and he is regarded as one of the best athletes and wrestlers to come out of the U.S despite many difficult disadvantages he faced and continues to face in his life. Mark did not start wrestling until the 11th grade, he was a great athlete but never was exceptional at any one thing until he began wrestling after getting fed up with his older brother Dave who was a wrestler pushing him around when they fought. Mark envied his older brother and his skill and wished to follow him, but his first year in wrestling did not go well and even now at a young age he had troubles with his back due to a genetic problem with the shape of his spine. His senior year started off the same but he refused to lose and by the end of the season despite not winning any tournaments at the beginning of the year he won every state qualifying tournament and states. He went on with his brother to university where he won three NCAA championships. They each then went on to the Olympics in 1984 and the both returned with gold medals. This was not enough for Mark so he went on to win the world championships the next two years in a row. This gave Mark Schultz the record for most world titles won by a U.S wrestler. Then Mark had quit wrestling and moved on to Coaching at the Foxcatcher estate farm for high level wrestling athletes with his brother. Then in 1996 John Du Pont the man who funded the Foxcatcher estate murdered Dave Schultz at his house on the estate for unknown reasons. Du Pont is a diagnosed paranoid schizophrenic and it is believed that that is a factor in the murder. This devastated Mark but he kept strong emotionally and continued on with his life by filling in for a UFC bout a few months after the death of his brother. Mark won the match but because he did not have money for health insurance he decided to continue on was not worth it. After his one and only bout his back also gave out and left him crawling around the house for days until he was able to get surgery. Furthermore in 1999 he set up a Brazilian jujitsu studio where he received a staph infection in a cut on his arm that soon almost took his arm and possibly his life. He is still suffering the effects of these events but he puts these things aside in order to continue to lead others around him in the sport of wrestling and as an example in life to never give up. His emotional strength is an inspiration to many and is possibly just as impressive as his well established wrestling career.
