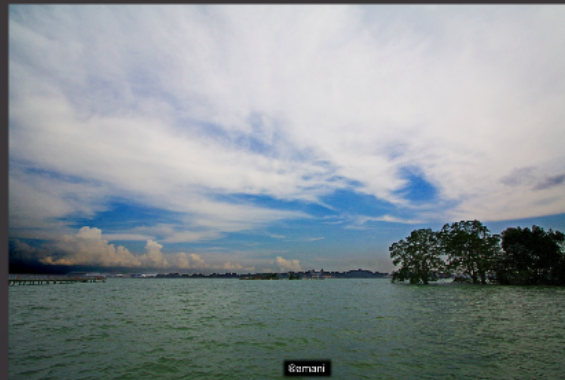




Chek Jawa Wetlands
