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
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How context contributes to meaning


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


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- three 9-year-old Japanese boys learning English, in Japan
- total of 3 lessons in pragmatics, over 6 weeks, total 120 minutes
- explored the impact of pragmatics-focused English-instruction, specifically through picture books
- followed with expanded discussion steered by teacher towards both verbal statements and non-verbal behaviours in illustrations







- visuals helped students in understanding pragmatics at cognitive level, yet knowledge was not internalized
- students unlikely to transfer skills to novel situations (not self-regulating)

- Narratives, dialogue, and visual cues are important to remember during lesson planing
- Emphasizes on the importance of personal expression and situational language

 Students rely on visual gestures to understand positive/negative sayings (politeness as it's used in the article)
