Farming:

- Used a method called Three Field system.
- This system the land was divided into thirds. One field was planted in the fall with the winter wheat or rye and harvested in the beginning of summer. In late spring the second field was planted with their oats, barley, legumes or lentils which would then be harvested in the late summer, and the last field would be not be planted so the nutrient in the soil could build back up.



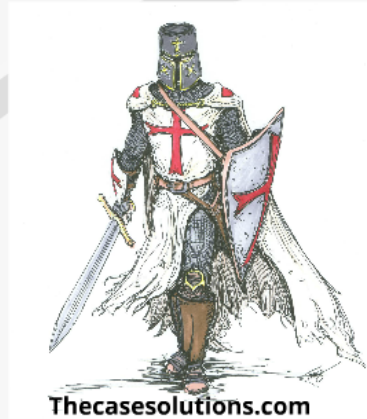
