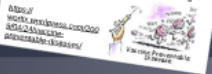




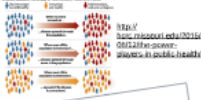

- There was a study done in 2005 that was published stating that there was a link between these two things, but it was quickly disproved and the author believed the study had too many flaws.
- "The New England Journal of Medicine has reviewed extensively all published reports about autism and has concluded that there is no convincing evidence to suggest that any vaccine causes autism" (Vaccines 11).



The Effectiveness of Vaccines

- Vaccines in society today are proven to be very safe. Although they do have the fully guaranteed to work or to 100% safe, they do not.
- The flu vaccine in Europe "strongly" prevents death after between 1.6 to 2.1 million cases, and prevent between 25,200 and 27,200 deaths" (provid 9).

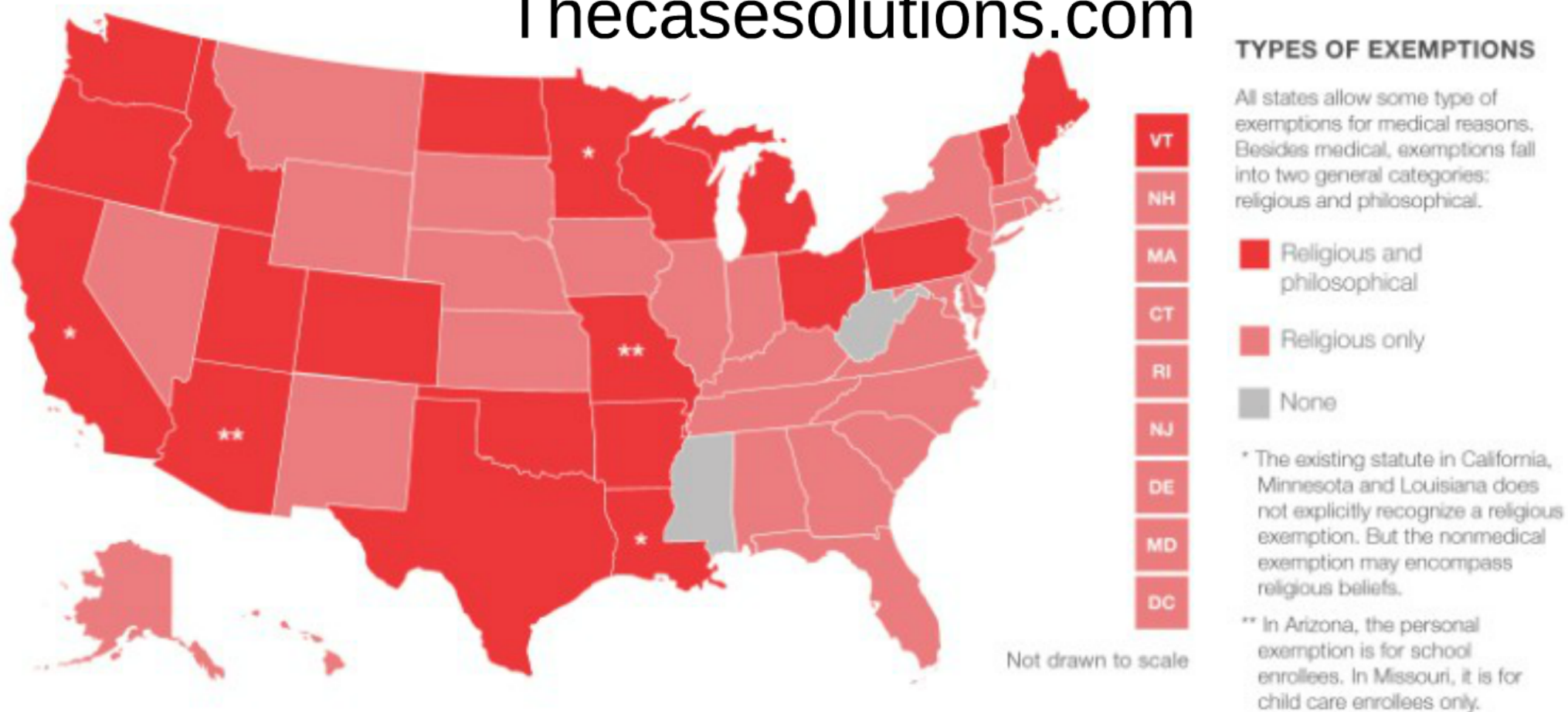
