Raw Materials - Something used by an industry to be made into a more finished product

Market - Customers of a country

Labor Supply - Total number of people working and looking for work in an area

Transportation - Movement of people or supplies from one place to another.

Political Decisions - decision made by government that will help attract new business or, if it is not careful, that will drive investment away


