budgetary policy and monotary policy

- external debt situation has improved significantly since the agreement on a debt with the creditor countries of the "Paris Club" in spring 2005
- by dramatically lower oil prices and ever-widening demands for the US dollar Naira loses value

economic activities

- Oil production is the main industry of Nigeria (14 percent of gross domestic product <GDP>)
- Services do about 50 percent of GDP (example:telecommunications)

daily production fluctuates due to illegal branches, sabotage and lack of maintenance

external economic environment

- Nigeria exports crude oil primarily -> trade balance is highly dependent on the price of oil
- most important trading partner: China, USA, India, Member States of EU
