

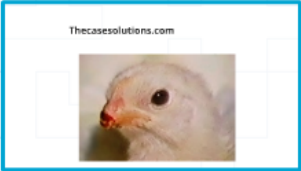

Cage Free Eggs still raised in confined, enclosed conditions  
-higher risk of disease transmission  
-limited natural movement  
-higher risk of developing respiratory disease and other ailments  
-hens are dehydrated and do-vented to prevent aggression and cannibalism  
-higher rate of salmonella. Eggs are the number one delivery vector for salmonella (DHS)

Cage Free vs Free Range  
-Free Range means that the hens are raised in an open farm with access to roam - think traditional style farms  
-Cage free inside the farm owner's legs in cages  
-Eggs may still be grown in packed industrial farms  
-No access to sunlight - >25% risk of infection

*Sustainability*  
-Cage Free farms may still rely on mechanical means of harvest  
-Produce eggs with greater efficiency than free-range farms, less than battery-cage farms  
NUTRITIONALLY  
-Free Range Eggs are healthier: 10% less fat, 34% less cholesterol  
-Smaller farms have smaller output, less of an environmental footprint  
-Studies confirm that the more space allocated for hens, the greater their lifespan, health, weight, and overall utility
