



- Autonomic nerves




- Diabetic Neuropathy affects 60% to 70% of diabetics.

- Excessive sweating.





#### Failed Treatments

- Medications: pain relievers, anti-seizure medications and antidepressants.
- Therapies such as: transcutaneous electrical nerve stimulation, plasma exchange and intravenous immune globulin, and physical therapy.
