Theodore Sizer was commonly known as "the father of Essential School Movements". He had been one of the most prominent educational reform advocates and he helped shape the national discourse on education and he revisited the ideas of what schools should be like in the modern time. He combined the diversity of private and public schools to set common principles.

### Carol Ann Tomlinson



Carol Ann Tomlinson had the idea that when you approach teaching in different ways the students are more attentive and the quality of the curriculum is higher.

### Kay Toliver



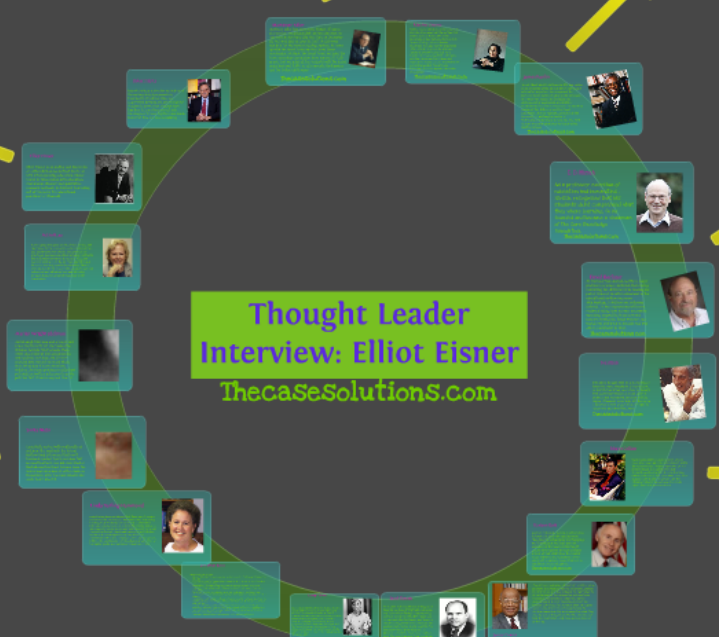
