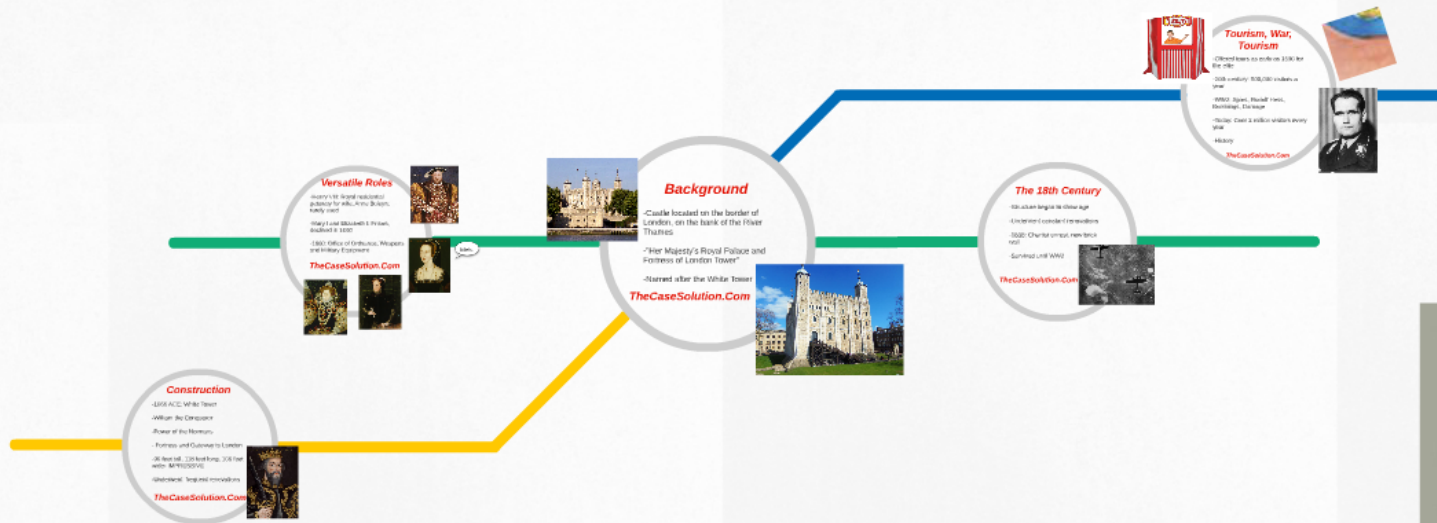


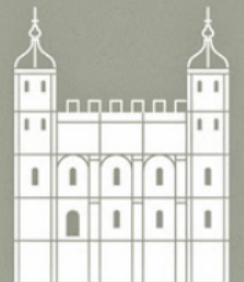

- 1066 ACE: White Tower

- 90 feet tall, 118 feet long, 106 feet wide- IMPRESSIVE
- Underwent frequent renovations

-Henry VIII: Royal residential  
getaway for wife, Anne Boleyn;  
rarely used

-Mary I and Elizabeth I: Prison,  
declined in 1660

-1660: Office of Ordnance, Weapons  
and Military Equipment

-WW2: Spies, Rudolf Hess, Bombings, Damage

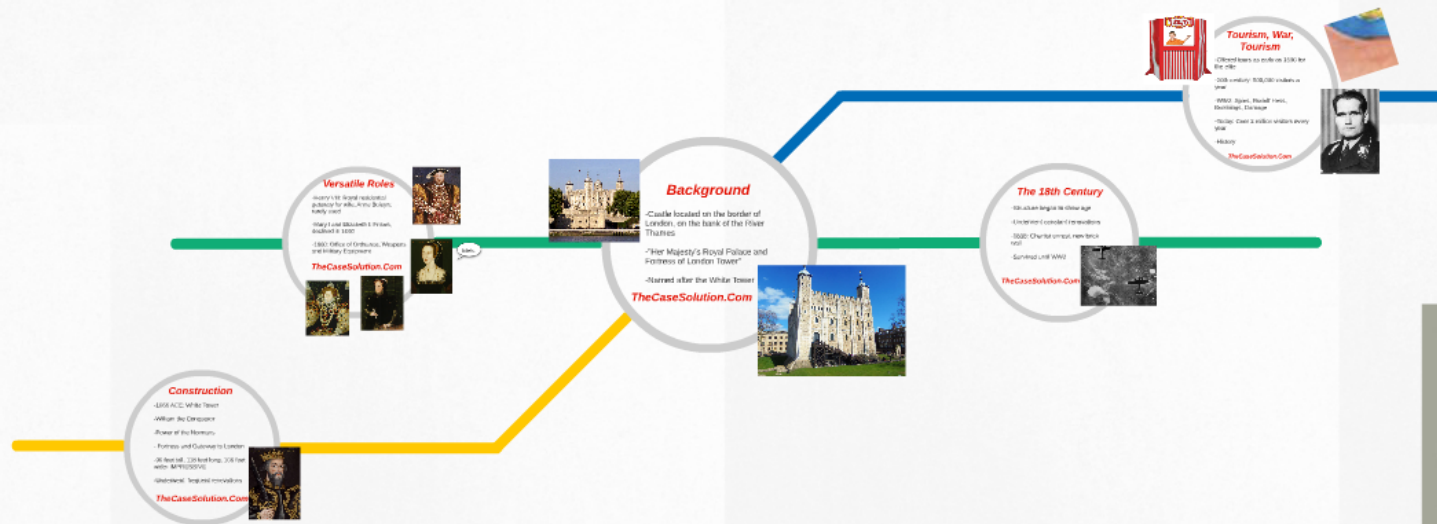
-Today: Over 2 million visitors every year
