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- Expectations of performance for the professional teacher
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- Establishes that teachers are reflective, caring, and lifelong learners

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Understanding the Standards

- Each standard has several quality indicators.
- Data points or measures are offered for each one.
- State assessments are not the sole source when deciding the performance level of a teacher
- Measures and data points are not a checklist: Just a suggestion!
