
## ***Schooling and Career:***

# *Before Being President*


- Served as a naval officer for seven year in the nuclear submarine program

- Carter's slogan: "A Leader, For a Change"
- Carter went in relatively unknown, compared to the nine other people going for the nomination.
- Each of the other Democrats dropped out until only Jimmy Carter remained.

## *Time in Office*

- Jimmy Carter was elected to office in November of 1976 at the age of 52.
- He only served one term, ending his term in 1980 at the age of 56.

# ***Domestic Policy***

- Carter tried to cut inflation and lower unemployment by jawboning large corporations to keep their prices low, but rejecting price and wage controls made by the government, which led to increases in both inflation and unemployment.
- The energy crisis of 1979 made matters worse as Middle East oil companies began to dramatically increase the price of oil in the states.
