- American energy company based in Houston, Texas.
- Formed in 1985 by Kenneth Lay.
- A Houston Natural Gas and InterNorth merger.
- The scandal was publicized in October 2001.
- Dissolution of Arthur Andersen.
- Largest Corporate Bankruptcy (\$63.4 Billion in assets) and Biggest Audit Failure in history.

Specifics The Case Solutions.com

- · Jeffrey Skilling's (CEO) hidden agenda.
- Used accounting loopholes, special purpose entities, and poor financial reporting.
- Inflated profits by hiding debts from failed deals and projects.
- Andrew Fastow (CFO) mislead Enron's BOD and Andersen.
- From US \$90.75/ share (mid-2000) to US \$1/ share (Nov 2001).

- US SEC began an investigation.
- · The implications of the investigation.
- Jeffrey Skilling is incarcerated at Federal Prison Camp (FPC) in Montgomery, Alabama.
