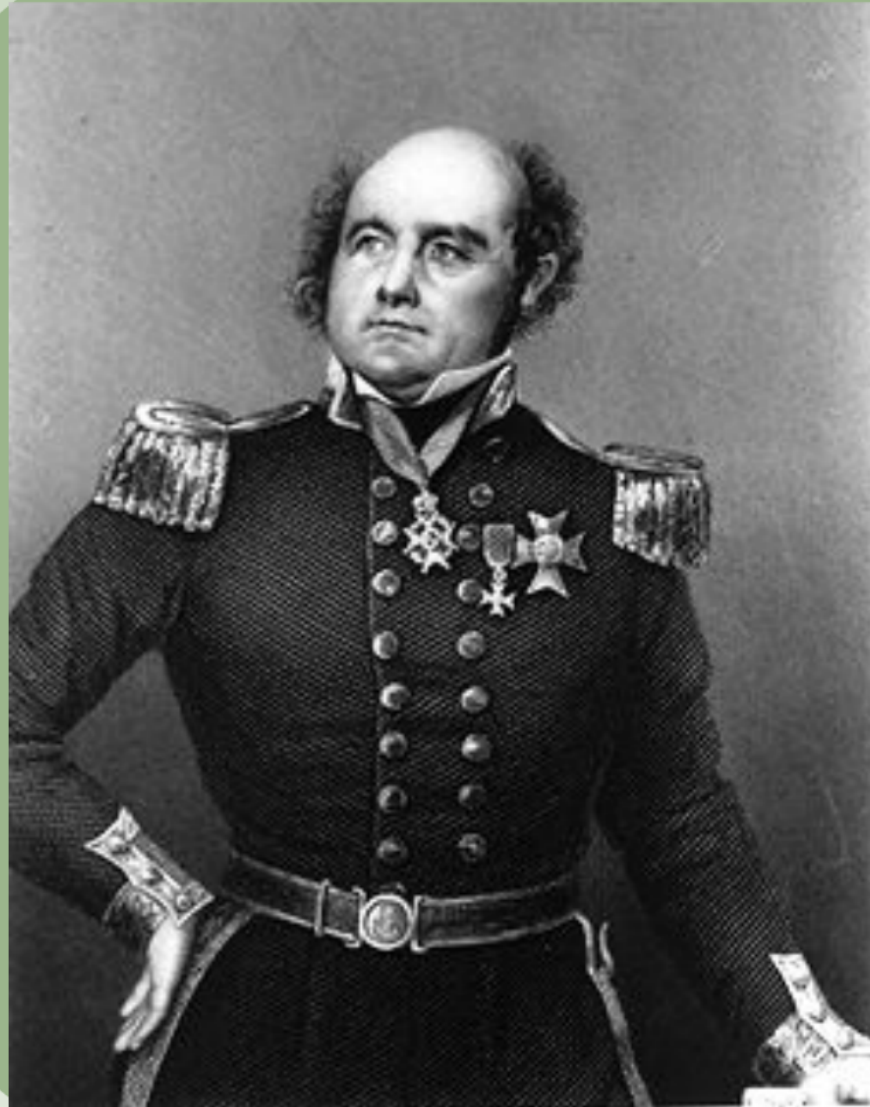

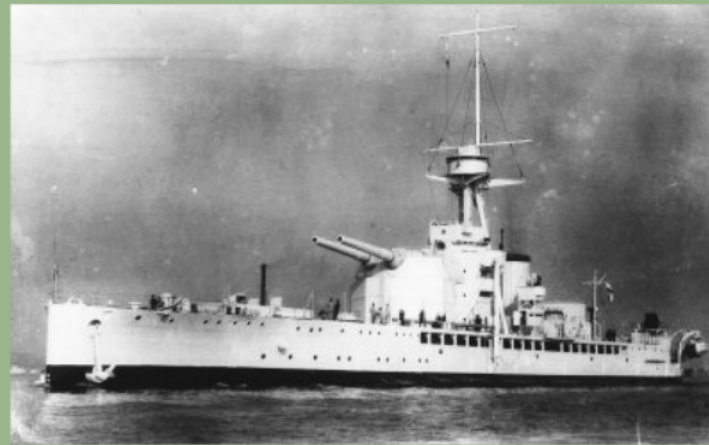
The Franklin Expedition

- Franklin and his crew set out on May 19, 1845.
- The ships they traveled on were called **HMS Erebus** and **HMS Terror**.
 - The living conditions on the ship were unbearable.
- Franklin was last seen in Baffin Bay before his disappearance.
 - The weather conditions were too extreme so they were forced to stop near King William Island.
 - Franklin along with all his crew members eventually died.
 - Search parties set out to retrieve Franklin and the crew but, none were successful.

The Discovery
