- You have a reason to read the story.
- You will feel motivated to read the book.
- Students with a reason to read will also comprehend the story better, as they are looking for information that will verify or contradict their prediction.

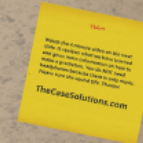
