

Meaning:

Services of general economic interest (SGEI) are economic activities that public authorities identify as being of particular importance to citizens and that would not be supplied (or would be supplied under different conditions) if there were no public intervention. Examples are transport networks, postal services and social services.

Definition: There is no definition of SGEI.

- public authorities have a responsibility to ensure their supply regardless of whether they are profitable in a free market
- The distinction between SGIs and SGEIs is equally hard to pin down, and is also subject to interpretation by the European Court of Justice
- Since the late 1980s, the Commission has pursued a policy of market-opening
- liberalisation has had the effect of replacing single, public monopolies with a large group of private quasi-monopolies.

Limited scope of SGEI

Given the absence of a definition and a legal framework for SGEI remains unclear whether an entire sector could be designated as a service of general economic interest or only those parts where restrictions on the Treaty rules are necessary in order for the public interest tasks concerned to be performed

Public services-SGIs or SGEIs

For this reason the ETUC regards universal access to public services to be a fundamental right, and a pillar of the Exercises Societ Model.
