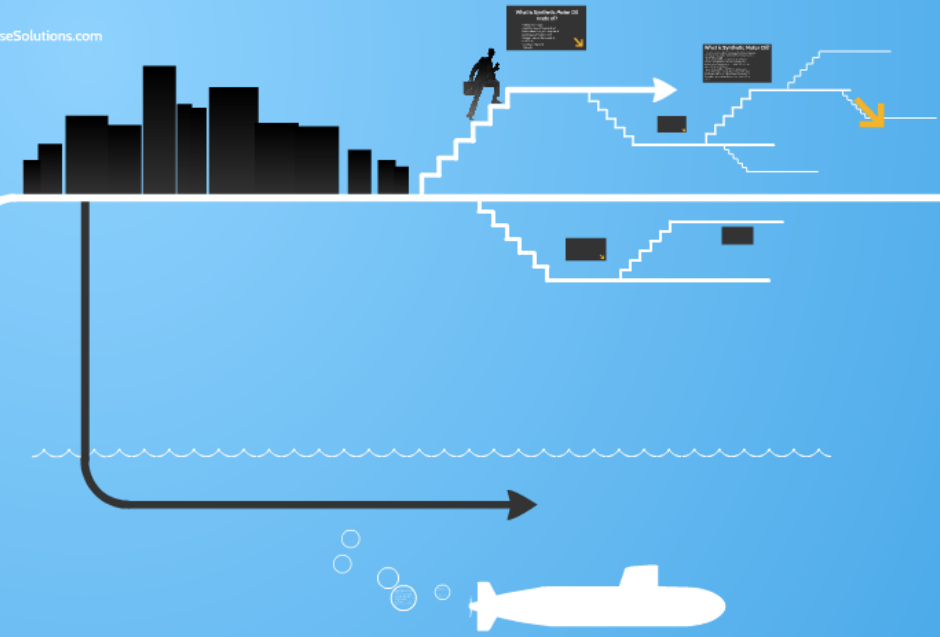
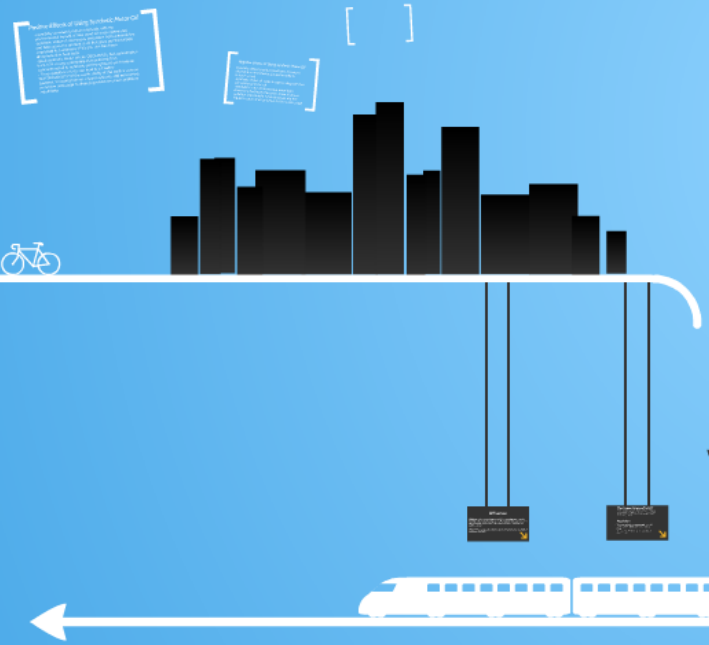

What is Synthetic Motor Oil?

- *Conventional oil is simply refined crude oil. Synthetic motor oil is not only refined, but is also distilled, purified, and broken down into its basic molecules.*

- *Synthetic Motor Oil is a NATURAL CAPITAL: Natural resources and natural services that keep us and other species alive and support our economies(widely use in air crafts, cars, space shuttles, etc).*

- *Synthetic Motor Oil is a NON-RENEWABLE resource: A resource that exists in a fixed amount in the earth's crust and has potential for renewal by geological, physical, and chemical processes taking place over hundreds of millions of years.*



What is Synthetic Motor Oil made of?

- *100% man-made*
- *liquid mixture of thousands of hydrocarbons (organic compounds containing only carbon and hydrogen atoms- these occur in fossil fuels)*
- *petroleum deposits*
- *lube oils*



Life Cycle

- Synthetic motor oil is made through a chemical process known as the Fischer-Tropsch process, starting with raw materials like methane, carbon monoxide, and carbon dioxide.



Manufacturing and Use

- Synthetic oil can then be manufactured using chemically modified petroleum components rather than whole crude oil, but can also be synthesized from other raw materials.
- Once it is broken down to its basic molecules it is rebuilt and added to, so that it can better protect against wear, high heat, cold weather and sludge buildup.
- The process helps engines run more efficiently for a longer period of time.
- Used as a lubricant for internal combustion engines, which powers cars, lawnmowers, engine-generators, and many other machines.



Disposal
