Once NWC and their fur trading rival, HBC merged their companies together, the French fought the British for trading rights on the St. Lawrence and Mississippi trade forts.

Just like the French, the British wanted exclusive trading rights with certain trade forts. For both British and French, it was impossible to give them these exclusive trade rights.
