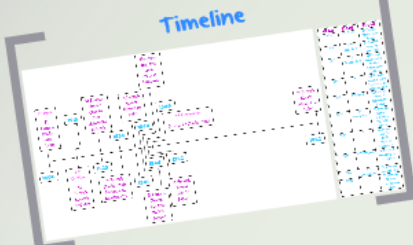

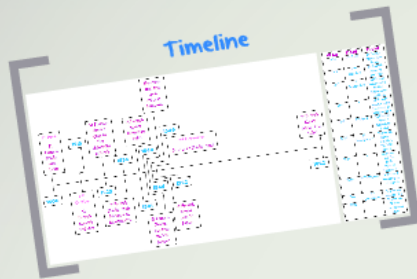

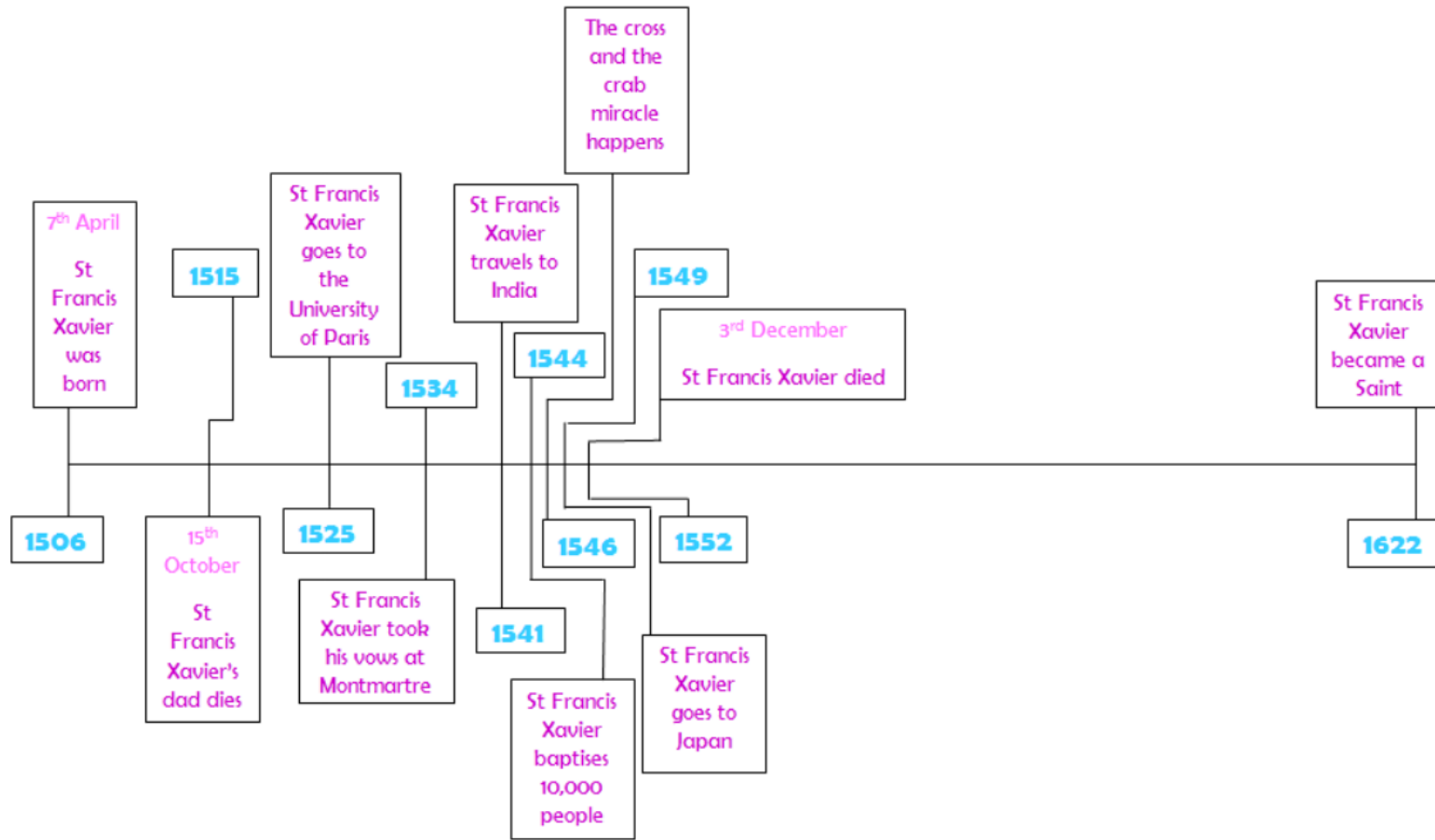

A miracle
