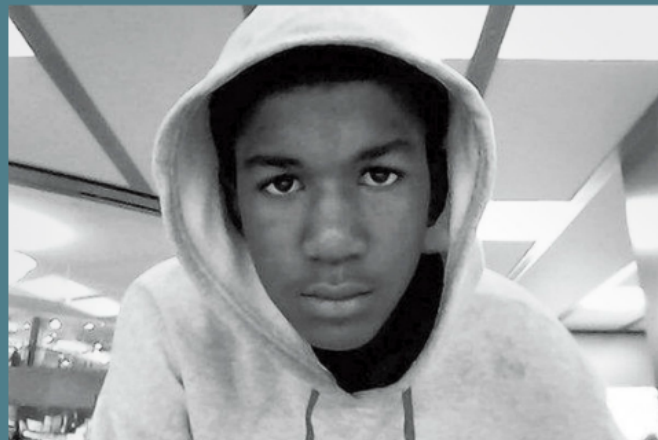

Trayvon Martin was born on February 5th, 1995. He grew up in Miami Gardens with his mother Subrina Fulton. In 2012, the African-American teen was suspended from school for 10 days after the discovery of drug residue in his backpack. For this suspension, Trayvon was sent to go live with his father for this 10 day period in Sanford, Florida which is 3.5 hours away.



On February 27th, while Trayvon Martin was still on his suspension, his parents filed a Missing Persons Report to Sanford Police.

24 HOURS EARLIER

On February 26th, 2012 George Zimmerman, part time student at Seminole State college and Neighborhood watch captain of Twin Lakes gated community called 9-1-1 to report a "suspicious person" in the neighborhood.



George Zimmerman is told by 9-1-1 dispatchers not to exit his SUV but disregarded his instructions. It was later reported to police that there was gunfire in the gated community.

Myron Martin was shot in the head and killed. His body was distinguished from a photo given to a police officer, who discovered that the suspicious person was a missing teen.

On the night of Trayvon's death, Zimmerman was found with a bloody swollen nose, and 2 black eyes having been punched by Trayvon before Trayvon was shot.
