


### Kinder Morgan

- Richard Kinder and Bill Morgan are ex-Enron Executives
- Largest energy infrastructure company in the US
- In 2005, KMI purchased Terasen Inc. in Canada for approximately \$5.6 billion
- Kinder Morgan is also still referred to and often known as the Trans Mountain Pipeline
- Kinder Morgan Canada operates a number of pipeline systems and terminal facilities



#### Kinder Morgan: An Overview

**Who: Kinder Morgan - American oil and gas company** 

What: Kinder Morgan proposed pipeline expansion

Where: An expansion of the existing 1150km of pipeline between Edmonton AB and Burnaby BC

When: Approved Nov 2016 - Building Sept 2017 - Use 2019

Why: The twinned pipeline would increase the capacity of the pipeline from 300 000 barrels per day to 890 000 barrels per day

# **Kinder Morgan: The Case for Expansion**

- KM Canada estimates its increased annual property tax bill to the City of Burnaby would be enough to pay for the city's garbage collection
- The total tax bill would be enough to employ 130 Burnaby firefighters.
- KM sought business audiences to convey economic impacts at the local level, particularly in communities expected to serve as hubs for construction activity

However, Burnaby Mayor Derek Corrigan, states additional tax benefits can't be proved or disproved at this point because Kinder Morgan hasn't filed any tax forms

### The Case for Expansion Ctn'd...

- Direct capital spending creating construction jobs and tax revenue
- Allows for greater economic activity within the Province for trade with the world
- Provides revenue for the expansion of schools, health facilities and other essential services

• Expansion of the energy industry in BC leads to increased prosperity for BC, AB, and Canada

## The Case For Expansion: A Closer Look

- Biased economic assessment report
- BC bears the risks---> Alberta receives majority benefits
- Unsustainable careers
  - Grossly exaggerated estimates of economic benefits (GDP, workers hired, tax revenue generated...etc.)
