who was it founded by??

England gave the land to Captain John Mason. Since he lived in Hampshire County, England, he named the colony "New Hampshire."



was anybody else living in the new colony??

There were three native American Indian tribes located in New Hampshire: the Abenaki and the Pennacook tribes.



How were they treated??

The two tribes were treated very harshly by the settlers. Many died from diseases that were brought from England. The settlers also scalped and killed Indians at will.

what do you mean by punishment??

Puritans especially were intolerant toward those who held views other than their own. Those not practicing the Puritan faith were punished by being whipped and sometimes persecuted.



did any of them survive??

Quite a few native Americans survived the harsh treatment. Those that did had to protect they were settlers or flee to Canada where both tribes united and are still on reservations there today.

did the puritans control anything else

The Puritans controlled many of the rules that governments agencies do today. For example, Puritans operated laws to track, and a minister often held classes in his home. Most students had to pay fees, so most poor parents could not send their children to school at all. Instead, they taught their children at home.

and why??

Captain John Mason was an explorer in New Hampshire and a fishing colony. The quest for furs and fishery was the major job to use it completely. He died not long after. Many people who arrived there also went there to escape persecution or other religious views.

was the fishing industry successful??

Actually not to many's. All of the fish were located further north of New Hampshire and they were only making a small profit. So New Hampshire started a Ship-Making Industry and found that to be a successful industry in the new world which they explored.



were there any other reasons that people settled in new hampshire??

Yes, some migrants that came to Colonial America were in search religious freedom. London did not make the Church of England official in the colonies—it never sent a bishop—so religious practice became diverse. Generally, all colonists were deeply religious, and by far most belonged to the Protestant faiths—Anglican, Puritan, and Lutheran. Puritan was most prominent and those that did not follow their beliefs were punished.

Anything else..??

Besides supervising education in the colonies, churches cared for the poor and kept public records such as those for marriage and death. Meetings were held in churches, which were used as community centers for courtship, socializing, and sharing news.


and..??

Church laws governed colonial activity, and the courts enforced these laws. For example, one law made sure that the Sabbath was observed by prohibiting any cooking, shopping, hair cutting, or not making those Saturday afternoon to windows on Sunday.




where??

New Hampshire is located in the Northeastern United States. It borders New York, Vermont, Massachusetts, Canada, and the Atlantic ocean.





HOW did the new colony make money fishing??

They built several fishing stations around the coast. Because of this, many fishermen migrated to New Hampshire. This led to more revenue.



did the puritans allow any other religion??

No they did not. In fact they didn't accommodate the Jewish Sabbath the Puritans did not like other religious minorities and would not allow them the freedom to follow their own beliefs or conduct their own worship services. Even voting and other political rights were restricted to members of a certain church group. Roman Catholics and Jews were not allowed to vote in most colonies. Puritans also denied citizenship to Quakers and others.

and..??

Blue laws kept shops and businesses from opening on Sunday. Church officials assigned seating in churches according to sex, race, and wealth. Even slaves were allowed free time on the Sabbath.

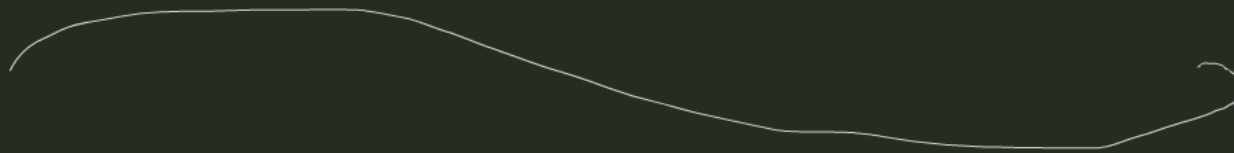


did that control ever end??



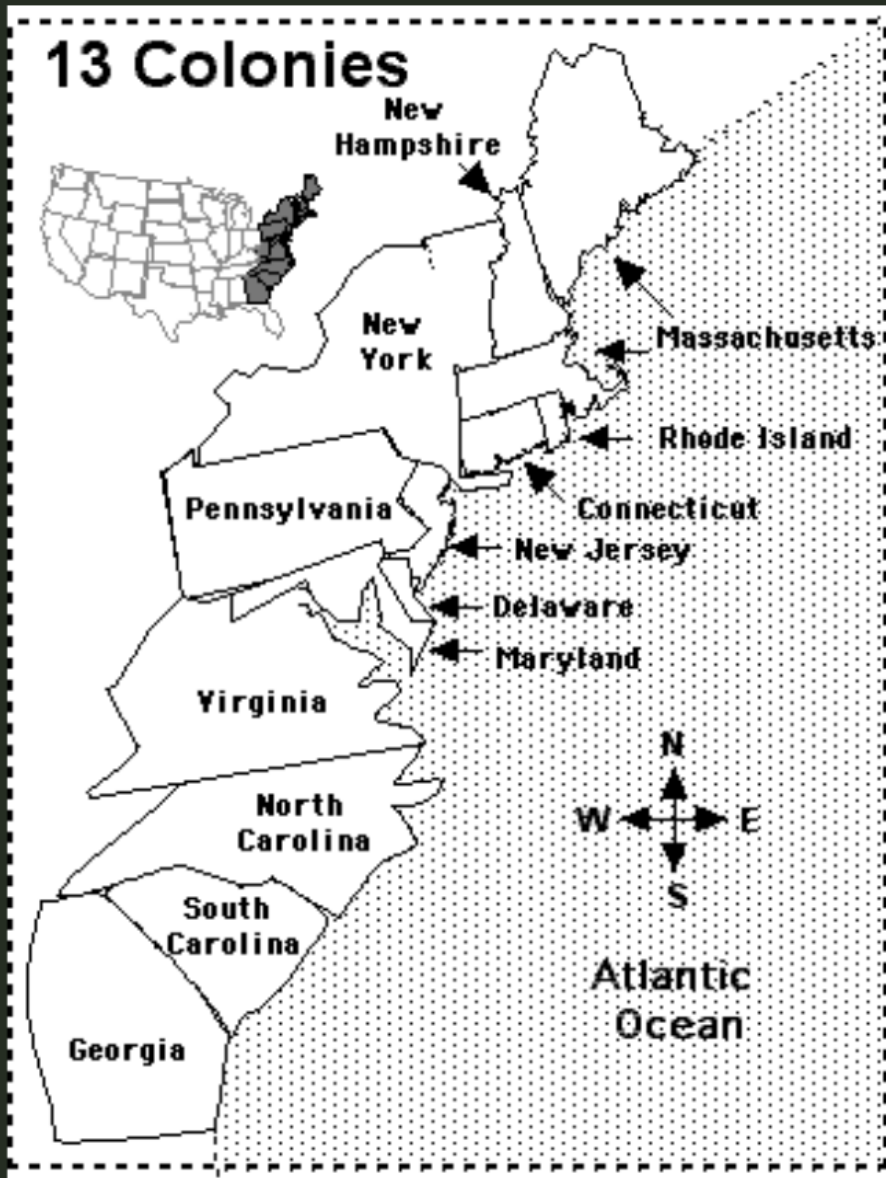
