Daily Bread Food Bank is a non-profit, charitable organization that is fighting to end hunger in our communities. Every year thousands of people across Toronto rely on food banks. Daily Bread serves these people through neighbourhood food banks and meal programs in over 170 member agencies. Daily Bread is trying to fight and end hunger in our communities. Daily Bread supports over 170 member agencies in running different kinds of food relief programs. The agency runs neighbourhood food banks where people can access prepared meals like soups or casseroles. They are the largest provider of emergency food relief in the GTA. Daily Bread sees a monthly average of 66,000 client visits.

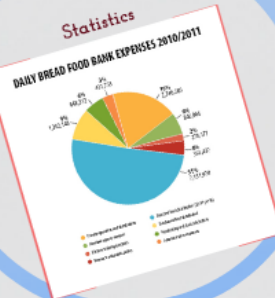
When was Daily Bread established?

Early in 1983, a group of concerned people began meeting to look at how to address the escalating poverty and hunger in Toronto. After much deliberation it was decided that an organization to distribute food was needed. This organization was meant to be temporary. A driving force in the beginning was Sister Marie Tremblay, who was also the first Executive Director and a member of the Sisters of St. Joseph, a Catholic order. Incorporation occurred in the fall and the first food was received at Christmas of 1983.

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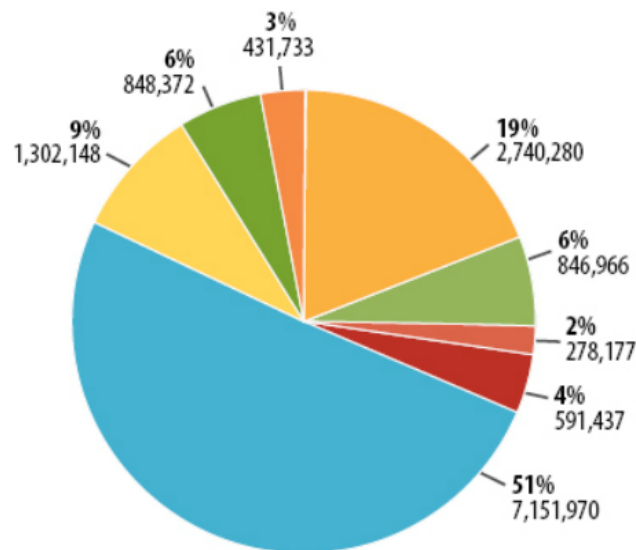
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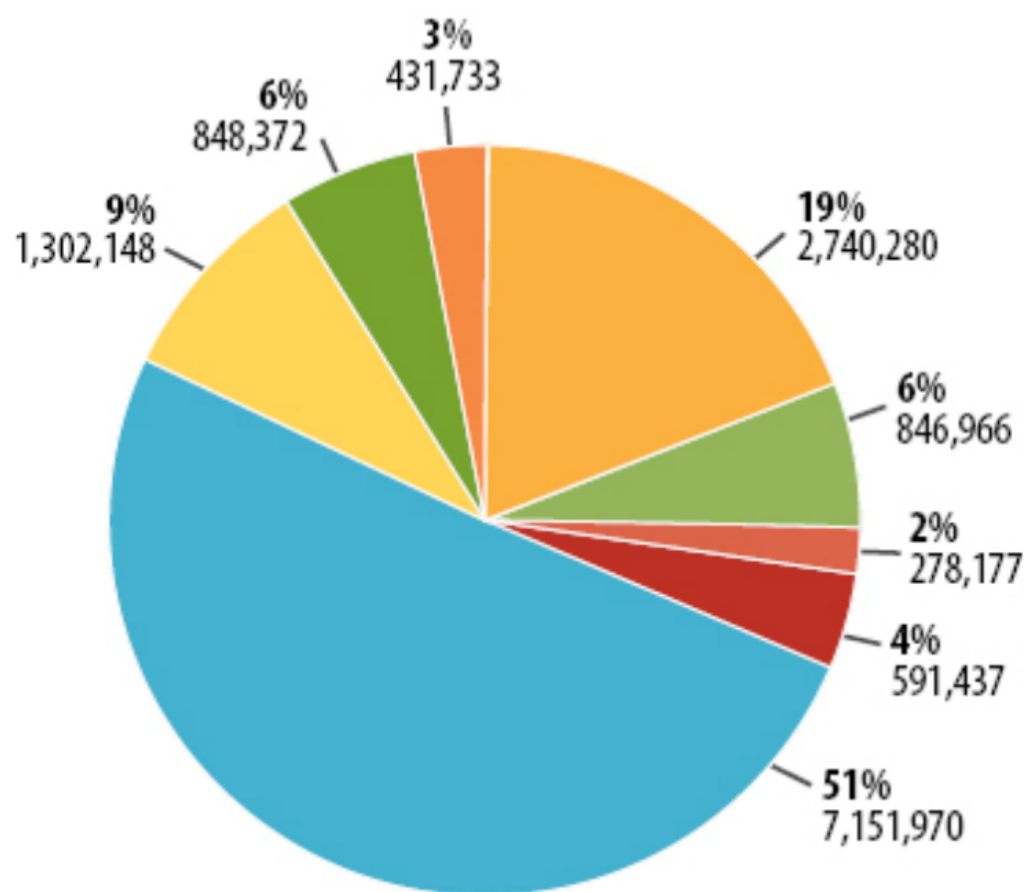
