



History of Mental Health

- 400 B.C. Greek physician Hippocrates views mental disorders as physiology and not just a reflection of displeasing the Gods or demonic possession

- 1407 First European institution for mentally ill established
- 1600's Mentally ill housed with handicapped, vagrants, and delinquents often kept in dungeons and chained
- Late 1700's First reform of institutions takes place when Phillippe Pinel forbids the use of chains and removes patients from dungeons


